SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER, 1939

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Traffic through the Canadian and United States locks increased to 10,437,879 tons from 4,466,103 tons a year ago. Shipments of wheat increased from 38,715,927 bushels to 63,486,203 bushels, other grains from 9,997,514 bushels to 14,373,250 bushels and iron ore from 1,651,167 tons to 6,053,512 tons.


Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal declined to 1,535,351 tons from 1,651,770 tons in November 1938, light grain shipments being the chief factor in the decrease. Barley was down by 41,859 tons, corn by 119,264 tons, oats by 8,011 tons and wheat by 214,992 tons. Bituminous coal was heavier by 111,978 tons, coke by 16,974 tons, petroleum and other oils by 77,510 tons and iron and steel by 22,286 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic for November increased from 1,065,317 tons in November 1938 to 1,072,509 tons, despite large decreases in grain shipments. The increase was practically all in bituminous coal which increased by 223,755 tons or 108 per cent; the only other large increase was 12,514 tons of pulpwood. The decrease in wheat was 126,559 tons or 4,218,633 bushels, and all other grains also showed decreases. Six of the canals were closed for the season as follows: St. Andrews, November 1 -Rideau, November 10 - Murray, November 21 - Trent, November 24 - Richelieu River, November 25 and Ottawa River November 27.
