SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

MAY, 1939

Sault Ste. Marie Canals- Canadian and United States Locks: Total traffic through the canals during May increased to 5,798,994 tons from 3,365,290 tons a year ago. Iron ore shipments were more than three times the May, 1938 shipments, increasing from 1,127,238 tons to 3,644,754 tons and wheat increased from 13,050,290 bushels to 32,494,256 bushels. The only large decrease was in westbound bituminous coal which decreased from 978,351 tons to 173,615 tons.

Welland Ship Canal: Total freight using the canal dropped from 1,740,005 tons in May, 1938 to 1,323,987 tons; corn shipments decreasing from 601,646 tons to 18,590 tons; barley being lighter by 30,570 tons; rye by 18,964 tons; pulpwood by 16,876 tons; soft coal by 183,057 tons and hard coal by 14,229 tons. Wheat increased by 277,755 tons; flour by 25,045 tons; paper by 14,679 tons and iron ore by 29,352 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Light shipments of barley, corn, oats, rye, petroleum, pulpwood, coal and ore more than offset increases in wheat, flour, paper and pulpwood and minor changes in other commodities and the total declined from 1,512,230 tons in May, 1938 to 1,189,263 tons. The largest decrease was corn from 494,291 tons to 20,174 tons and the largest increase was wheat from 226,429 tons to 416,536.

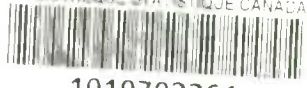
