SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

JULY, 1939.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight through the canal continued to increase, amounting to 9,597,596 tons for July compared with 5,551,693 tons in 1938. Iron ore almost doubled, increasing from 3,210,184 tons to 6,344,474 tons and wheat increased from 6,624,604 bushels to 26,366,355 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal increased from 1,529,375 tons in July 1938 to 1,659,282 tons, wheat increasing by 257,169 tons or 8,572,300 bushels, petroleum and oil by 21,229 tons and bituminous coal by 182,483 tons. Shipments of corn dropped from 439,779 tons to 22,179 tons and gasolene declined by 5,933 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Due to large decreases of corn, gasolene, pulpwood and iron ore, total traffic dropped from 1,178,255 tons in July 1938 to 1,119,143 tons. The decreases in the above commodities were 293,829 tons, 10,409 tons, 44,839 tons and 39,119 tons respectively. Wheat increased by 146,266 tons and bituminous coal was heavier by 128,956 tons.

Report on the Administration of the State for the Year 1911

CHAPTER I

GENERAL STATEMENT

The year 1911 was a year of unusual activity for the State of New York. The Legislature passed a number of important laws, and the Executive Department carried out a wide range of administrative reforms. The financial condition of the State was generally satisfactory, and the public works program was well advanced. The following table shows the principal items of the State's revenue and expenditures for the year.
