SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER, 1939.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Traffic through the Canadian and United States locks during September amounted to 11,492,582 tons compared with 6,624,115 tons in 1938 and 12,585,095 tons in 1937. Down bound iron ore was the largest item and it increased from 3,402,146 tons in 1938 to 7,985,295 tons. Wheat decreased from 37,537,917 bushels to 35,096,670 bushels and other grains increased from 10,412,778 bushels to 14,584,056 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal - Total traffic using the canal dropped to 1,564,487 tons from 1,785,768 tons in 1938; a decrease of 262,919 tons or 8,763,966 bushels of wheat was the largest decrease. Barley was lighter by 86,768 tons, corn by 30,192 tons, sugar by 9,868 tons, pulpwood by 10,604 tons and sand and gravel by 12,665 tons. Soft coal was heavier by 114,694 tons, iron, pig and bloom by 22,312 tons, and iron and steel by 24,038 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals - Traffic using the St. Lawrence Canal during September decreased from 1,295,614 tons in 1938 to 1,216,010 tons, wheat being lighter by 117,666 tons, barley by 77,699 tons, corn by 23,476 tons, gasoline by 15,654 tons, pulpwood by 13,903 tons and iron ore by 12,400 tons. Soft coal was heavier by 109,443 tons, sand by 21,060 tons, paper by 15,542 tons and iron, pig and bloom by 15,289 tons.
