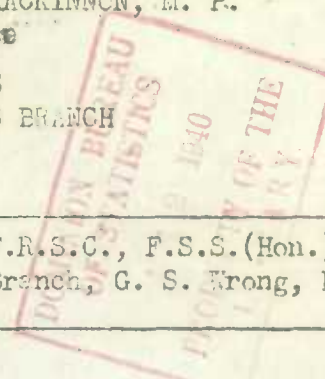

SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC
NOVEMBER, 1940.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Total traffic declined to 8,642,025 tons from 10,437,879 tons in November 1939. Wheat dropped from 63,486,203 to 40,590,805 bushels, flour from 1,312,810 to 958,190 barrels, iron ore from 6,053,512 to 5,809,999 tons and soft coal up bound, from 1,476,340 to 684,100 tons.

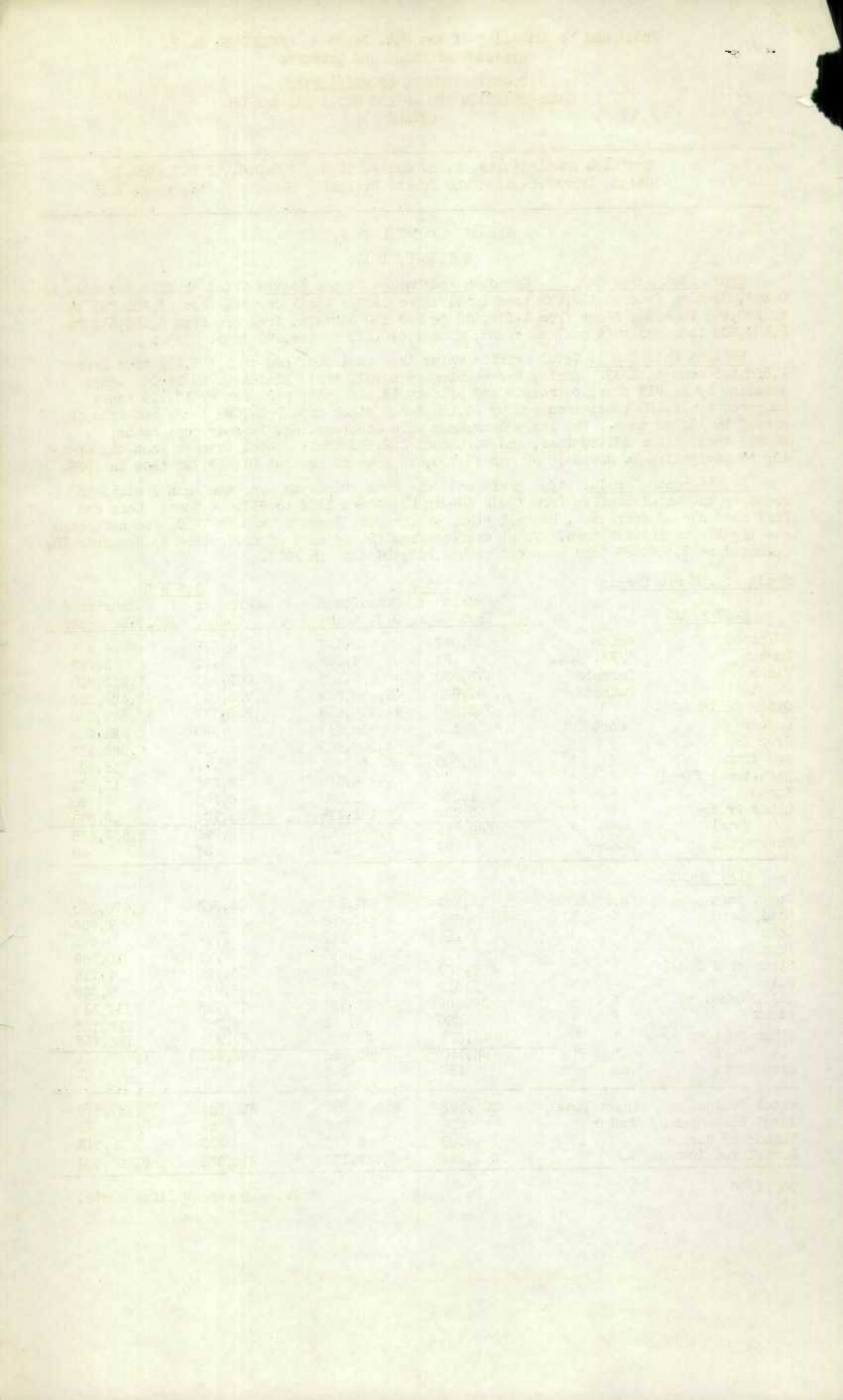
Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal declined to 1,555,201 tons from 1,528,908 tons in 1939. Barley was heavier by 24,612 tons; flax seed by 14,043 tons; gasoline by 32,918 tons; petroleum and oils by 83,535 tons; pig iron by 17,109 tons; pulpwood by 14,280 tons; iron ore by 34,158 tons; other ore by 24,099 tons, and sand and gravel by 28,749 tons. The large decreases were other grains, largely soya beans, 50,639 tons, flour 20,785 tons, and soft coal 199,153 tons. Total tonnage from the opening of navigation to November 30 was 12,700,015 tons as against 11,323,795 tons in 1939.

St. Lawrence Canals: Light grain and soft coal shipments were the main factors in reducing the total traffic from 1,072,509 in November, 1939 to 893,008 tons. Corn and flax seed showed increases, but all other grains were lighter than in 1939, and soft coal was lighter by 169,175 tons. Total traffic from the opening of navigation to November 30, amounted to 7,466,668 tons compared with 8,307,404 tons in 1939.
