SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


JUNE, 1940.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Total traffic through the locks increased to 13,455,390 tons as against 8,622,403 tons in June last year. Downbound iron ore was particularly heavy increasing to 9,808,831 tons or by 67 per cent. Wheat shipments were less than half of the May traffic and were slightly below June 1939. Other grains showed a similar trend. Upbound bituminous coal increased to 2,004,527 tons from 1,163,243 tons in 1939.

Welland Ship Canal: Wheat shipments declined from 426,132 tons in June 1939 to 219,266 tons and flour and other mill products also showed substantial decreases. Corn increased by 65,729 tons, petroleum and oils by 177,388 tons, iron by 24,566 tons, pulpwood by 17,356 tons, bituminous coal by 272,125 tons, and ore, other than iron and copper, by 49,635 tons, raising the total to 1,912,622 tons as against 1,580,403 tons in June 1939.

St. Lawrence Canals: A decrease in wheat shipments of 218,592 tons was the main factor in reducing the total traffic using the canals to 1,055 279 tons from 1,161,230 tons in June 1939. The chief increases were corn 71,935 tons, petroleum and oils 29,438 tons, pulpwood 29,288 tons, hard coal 20,350 tons, and soft coal 107,103 tons.
