SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


JULY, 1940

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight through the canal continued to increase, amounting to 13,842,224 tons for July compared with 9,597,596 tons in 1939. Iron ore increased from 6,344,474 tons in 1939 to 10,775,121 tons in 1940.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal increased from 1,659,282 tons in July 1939 to 1,832,326 tons, corn increasing by 75,225 tons or 2,686,607 bushels, petroleum and oil by 156,648 tons and bituminous coal by 93,456 tons. Wheat dropped from 383,857 tons to 220,938 tons, barley declined by 21,785 tons and oats by 19,517 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic on the canal increased from 1,119,143 tons in July 1939 to 1,122,961 tons in 1940. Corn increased by 86,780 tons or 3,099,286 bushels and bituminous coal by 85,992 tons. The large decreases were wheat 103,918 tons, wood pulp 23,620 tons and gasoline 22,561 tons.
