SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


AUGUST, 1940.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Total traffic through the locks increased to 13,713,289 tons from 10,551,560 tons in August 1939. An increase of 45 per cent or from 7,428,777 tons to 10,793,657 tons in down bound iron ore was the chief factor in this increase. Wheat increased from 22,182,409 bushels to 24,249,676 bushels, other grains declined and up bound soft coal dropped from 1,648,662 tons to 1,300,827 tons.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic increased to 1,819,720 tons from 1,712,809 tons in 1939. Soft coal was heavier by 186,295 tons, petroleum and other oils by 110,865 tons iron-pig and bloom by 14,346 tons, iron and steel by 17,160 tons and coke by 20,750 tons. Wheat decreased by 151,692 tons, pulpwood by 31,066 tons and iron ore by 62,044 tons but other ores increased by 31,544 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: With decreases in the majority of commodities using the Canals, total traffic dropped to 1,007,968 tons from 1,284,021 tons in 1939. The large decreases were, wheat 233,338 tons, barley 15,804 tons, oats 34,919 tons, gasoline 23,667 tons, wood pulp 22,893 tons, pulpwood 22,860 tons and coke 9,504 tons. Cornincreased by 31,249 tons, petroleum and other oils by 25,324 tons and soft coal by 69,218 tons.
