
SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC NOVEMBER, 1941

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Iron ore down the canals declined from 10,067,057 tons in October to 8,190,918 tons in November which was 2,380,919 tons or 41 p.c. above the November 1940 tonnage. Wheat shipments amounted to 39,038,487 bushels as against 25,942,470 in October and 40,590,805 a year ago and total traffic in both directions amounted to 12,222,942 tons as against 8,642,025 tons in 1940.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal amounted to 1,466,136 tons as against 1,528,908 tons in November 1940. Wheat declined from 234,286 tons to 101,065 tons and barley, corn, oats and rye also showed decreases. Gasoline was down by 19,002 tons, petroleum and other oils by 11,049 tons, iron, pig and bloom by 10,432 tons, iron and steel by 41,590 tons, pulpwood by 14,696 tons, coke by 39,038 tons and sand, gravel and stone by 25,458 tons. The only large increases were 227,143 tons of bituminous coal and 53,858 tons of iron ore.

St. Lawrence Canals: All grains down the canals showed decreases from November 1940 shipments. Gasoline, iron and steel, pulpwood, anthracite coal and sand, gravel and stone also showed substantial decreases reducing the total from 893,008 tons in 1940 to 774,350 tons. The only increases of importance were 187,864 tons of bituminous coal and 12,663 tons of petroleum and other oils. Total traffic from the opening of navigation to the end of November was 6,893,131 tons as against 7,466,668 tons in 1940.
