## SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

## AUGUST, 1941

Sault Ste. Merie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: The August freight traffic through the canals amounted to 15,235,189 tons, which has been exceeded by only the July record of 15,510,601 tons. Iron ore declined from 12,007,723 tons in July to 11,771,115 tons. Wheat also declined from 39,898,149 to 25,822,793 bushels but soft coal increased from 1,394,717 to 1,789,026 tons. For August 1940 total traffic amounted to 13,713,289 tons.


Welland Ship Canal: A few large increases more than offset many smaller decreases and raised the total traffic using the canal from 1,819,215 tons in August 1940 to 1,858,155 tons. The large increases were iron ore 38,827 tons, petroleum and other oils 47,403 tons, flour 23,121 tons, pulpwood 15,447 tons and hard coal 15,042 tons. All grains except flaxseed showed decreases; gasoline was down by 23,275 tons, iron and steel by 24,036 tons, soft coal by 34,730 tons and coke by 24,413 tons

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic using the canals during August declined to 974,666 tons from 1,007,968 tons in 1940. Wheat declined by 45,936 tons, corn by 29,748 tons and barley by 14,727 tons. The large increases were flour 20,161 tons, pulpwood 11,491 tons and soft coal 23,625 tons.
