SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER, 1945

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Total freight through the canals during September amounted to 15,404,596 tons as compared with 15,962,268 tons in September, 1944. Downbound iron ore declined from 11,703,924 to 11,015,677 tons and upbound soft coal declined from 2,084,218 to 2,007,750 tons. Shipments of wheat increased from 1,542,602 to 1,467,731 tons or by over 4,000,000 bushels.

Welland Ship Canal: Total traffic using the canal increased from 1,504,565 tons in September last year to 1,789,017 tons, wheat increasing by 230,790 tons, pulpwood by 44,510 tons and iron ore by 34,997 tons. Gasoline declined by 15,968 tons and petroleum and oils by 16,486 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total freight using the canals increased from 814,142 tons in 1944 to 984,182 tons. The large increases were: wheat 164,288 tons, pulpwood 41,144 tons, soft coal 22,393 tons and petroleum and other oils 21,329 tons. Anthracite coal declined by 14,805 tons, paper by 16,552 tons, gasoline by 25,155 tons and oats by 13,046 tons.
