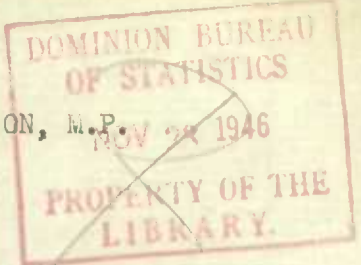

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: The total traffic through the canals during October increased to 14,906,809 tons from 14,720,671 tons in October, 1945. Iron ore declined from 10,511,708 to 9,956,464 tons, wheat from 1,687,496 to 1,325,210 tons, other grain from 480,030 to 296,087 tons, but upbound soft coal increased from 1,452,755 to 2,558,251 tons and oil and gasoline from 127,416 to 176,612 tons.

Welland Ship Canal: Light shipments of grain more than offset heavy shipments of coal and reduced the total freight using the canal to 1,571,274 tons from 1,599,941 tons in 1945. Wheat declined from 366,778 to 236,066 tons and oats from 30,338 to 8,598 tons. Soft coal increased from 383,240 to 611,753 tons and hard coal increased from 6,800 to 18,345 tons. Gasoline also increased from 59,295 to 92,753 tons. Iron ore declined from 308,896 to 179,972 tons and pulpwood from 72,808 to 45,044 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: Total traffic increased by 40,608 tons or from 900,448 tons in 1945 to 941,056 tons despite a decrease of 215,482 tons of wheat and 25,766 tons of oats. Soft coal increased by 175,739 tons, gasoline by 42,762 tons, other ore (other than copper and iron) by 39,691 tons and miscellaneous freight by 34,421 tons.
