Sault Ste, Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Navigation closed for the 1947 season on December 15 through the U.S. locks and on the 7th through the Canadian canal, which was a few days earlier than in 1946, when the last vessels were passed through on the 17th & 12th respectively. Total freight through the combined system in December amounted to 1,653,262 tons compared with 1,448,642 tons in the same month of 1946, an increase of over 14 p.c. despite fewer days of operation. Wheat shipments were lighter but iron ore was up nearly 257,000 tons over December 1946.

During the season of navigation 110,887,970 tons passed through the locks compared with 91,740,696 in 1946 and the all time high of 120,200,814 in 1942. Eastbound iron ore rose from 62.0 million tons to 80.6 millions, wheat was 7,591,376 tons compared with 7,359,440 downbound in 1946. The volume of up or westbound freight was increased slightly at 18,993,314 tons compared with 18,921,538 in the year to year comparison. The increase was principally in stone, gravel and sand, while oil and gasoline declined.

Welland Ship Canal: Navigation closed on December 19th, one day later than in 1946 and December traffic reached 447,758 tons, an increase of 97,370 tons over the same month of 1946. Wheat and soft coal movement was much heavier but no iron ore was locked through compared with 10,200 tons in December 1946.

During the season of navigation from April 15th to December 19th 11,828,827 tons of freight used the canal compared with 10,580,146 tons in 1946, an advance of nearly 12 p.c. in volume. Increases were recorded in wheat, barley, rye, corn, gasoline, pulpwood, soft coal and iron ore. Wheat was 1,798,378 tons against 1,442,770 in 1946, while soft coal rose from 3,814,514 to 4,152,753 tons and iron ore was 1,176,069 tons compared with 935,454. Lighter movements of oats, paper, pig iron and coke were experienced.

St. Lawrence Canals: The last vessel was locked through on the 11th of December, two days later than in 1946. Freight tonnage for the month was 34,087 compared with 35,979 tens in December 1946. No wheat passed through compared with 11,176 tens in the corresponding month of 1946.

During the navigation period from April 19th to December 11th a total of 7,179,594 tens of freight used the canals compared with 5,750,578 tens in 1946, to register an increase of 1,429,016 tens or nearly 25 p.c. Wheat rose 274,586 tens to 940,555 while flour was 22,545 compared with 4,044 tens in 1946, petroleum and other cils totalled 696,529 tens against 308,388 while soft coal rose to 2,940,259 tens compared with 2,395,970 in the proceding year. Iron ore advanced to 90,736 tens from 13,455. Principal declined were in the passage of cats, barley, flaxseed, pig iron, iron and steel, paper, hard coal and miscellaneous ores.

Freight traffic on the Ottawa and Rideau Canals was little changed from 1946, the Richelieu system volume increased from 59,281 tons in 1946 to 61,086 and St. Peter's from 20,677 tons to 34,262. Total freight using all Canadian canals for the year amounted to 21,537,191 tons, an increase of 2,882,272 tons or 15.4 p.c. over 1946. Some 20,879 vessels used the Canadian canals compared with 18,983 in 1946.
