SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC

JUNE, 1947

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks:- The total traffic through the canals during June increased from 12,323,451 tons in 1946 to 15,565,763 tons. Downbound iron ore increased from 8,708,774 to 11,837,343 tons, wheat from 605,376 to 871,419 tons, other grain from 91,018 to 198,966 tons and upbound oil and gasoline from 107,376 to 143,997 tons. Upbound bituminous coal shipments declined from 2,273,467 to 2,025,414 tons.

Welland Ship Canal:- Traffic using the canal increased to 1,426,970 tons from 808,861 tons in 1946. Shipments of wheat increased by 119,901 tons, gasoline by 54,771 tons, oils by 58,391 tons, pulpwood by 27,139 tons, bituminous coal by 224,538 tons and iron ore by 64,057 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals:- Practically all the principal commodities passing through the canals showed increases over 1946 shipments and the total increased to 995,450 tons from 272,125 tons. Wheat increased from 33,890 to 173,877 tons, gasoline from 41,410 to 72,385 tons, petroleum and other oils from 16,045 to 109,127 tons, pulpwood from 11,548 to 67,718 tons and bituminous coal from 73,051 to 382,436 tons.
