SUMMARY OF CANAL TRAFFIC


SEPTELBER, 1950

The Canadian canal systems continued very active during September and freight passing through the canals totalled 3,695,543 tons - an all-time high - and 468,480 tons or 14.5 p.c. above September, 1949, when 3,227,063 tons were tallied. There were 3,281 vessels using the facilities during the month compared with 3,107 last year. Passengers numbered 5,496,down from 7,099 in the previous September, due to cessation of passenger service on the St. Lawrence and very little Walland traffic. Large gains were shown in the movement of soft coal, iron ore, pulpwood, paper, corn, sand, petroleum and miscellaneous freight. Wheat declined sharply from 1949 levels.

Some of the increased traffic was likely due to diversions from rail occasioned by the late August strike.

Sault Ste. Marie Ganals - Ganadian and United States Locks: Total freight tennage for the system during September rose to 15,594,194 tens, an increase of 2,589,703 tens or 19.9 p.c. over the same month last year. Both eastbound and westbound traffic boomed with east, or downbound, amounting to 13,191,504 tens against 11,680,924 tens during the provious September. Gains were shown in pulpwood up from 41,120 tl 71,034 tens, iron are at 12,300,956 against 9,945,328 tens and in flour, scrap iron, steel, stone and other freight which advanced 7,176 tens to 37,184 tens. Wheat declined sharply from 1,304,561 to 460,857 tens and other grains eased from 319,520 to 249,137 tens downbound. The movement west totalled 2,402,690 tens, an increase of 1,079,123 tens ever September, 1949, when work stoppages in the U. S. coal mines cut shipments. Soft ceal passing upwards gressed 1,926,335 tens compared with 969,299, and most of the other commedities were considerably heavier. Stene rose from 120,211 to 183,922 tens. Canadian locks handled 307,938 tens against 218,353 tens one year earlier. Passenger traffic improved over September, 1949 on the Canadian side but dropped from 9,945 to 5,351 for the tetal system.

Wellend Ship Canal: Traffic through the Welland during September grossed 1,976,840 tens compared with 1,814,735 tens last year and 1,838,629 tens in 1948. The gain of 162,105 tens over 1949 reflected increases in corn up from 48,706 to 91,331 tens, rye, flour, gaseline, pulpwood, paper, soft coal which rose from 362,474 to 632,463 tens, coke, iron ere at 305,424 against 119,905 tens, sand, and in all other freight which increased over 71,000 tens to 200,879 tens for the month. Declines were confined to barley, cats, wheat dropping from 619,216 to 220,511 tens, and petroleum cils. Passenger traffic shrank from 1,040 to only 4, the leading excursion vessel having been burnt at its dock in Terente last fall.



St. Lawrence Canals: A total of 1,352,164 tons were reported in September for the St. Lawrence system, a gain of 18.4 p.c. or 209,716 tons over the correspending period of 1949. Corn, rye, flour, petroleum, pulpwood, paper, woodpulp, soft coal, sand and miscellaneous freight advanced sharply. Petroleum and other cils totalled 166,080 tons against 48,990 tons one year carlier, pulpwood was up nearly 30,000 tons to 110,090 tons, paper more than doubled at 35,158 against 15,884 tons and soft coal jumped from 145,529 to 308,534 tons. All other freight totalled 260,083 tons compared with 195,347 tons a year provious. The rail strike in late August had encouraged water shipments and several vessels benefitted from the additional traffic between Quebec and Ontaric. Declinos were confined to wheat off from 373,362 to 190,132 tons and barley, cats and hard coal. Passenger traffic was nil against 1,167 in September of 1949 when service was available downbound.

The smaller canals registered over-all improvement with the Ottawa system freight at 42,662 tens against 35,385 tens and St. Andrew's up from 1,569 to 4,836 tens. Pleasure craft on all Canadian canals totalled 6,024 during the month compared with 5,559 one year earlier.


