

SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

OCTOBER, 1955

The tonnage of freight cleared through the eleven Canadian canals during October totalled 4,384,800 tons, an increase of 239,513 tons or 5.7 per cent over the October, 1954 total of 4,145,287 tons. Increased traffic was reported by the St. Lawrence, the Welland Ship and four of the smaller canals, while a decrease was recorded at the Canadian lock at Sault Ste. Marie, the Rideau, the Richelieu and the St. Peter's canals. Commodities responsible for the general advance over the previous October include iron ore and other freight. The number of vessel passages rose to 3,263 from 2,945 while the registered net tonnage declined to 3,890,151 tons from 4,000,978. The number of passengers and pleasure craft lockages were also higher this October, advancing to 276 and 1,517 from 113 and 1,380 respectively.

The St. Lawrence Canals: The total freight transported through the St. Lawrence system during October increased to 1,526,240 tons from 1,305,774 tons in October, 1954, a gain of 220,466 tons or 16.9 per cent. Although the tonnage of a number of commodities including wheat, barley and fuel oil was lower than in the previous October, an overall increase was reported as the tonnage of such commodities as flaxseed, bituminous coal, iron ore and other freight increased to a greater extent. Bituminous coal shipments advanced to 228,180 tons from 207,411; iron ore rose to 300,604 tons from 65,089 and cargoes of other freight increased to 215,608 tons from 167,753. Vessel passages numbered 1,253, aggregating 1,127,128 registered net tons as compared with 1,221 vessels of 1,072,901 net tons in the preceding October.

Welland Ship Canal: The volume of freight carried through the Welland Ship canal in October amounted to 2,529,568 tons as compared with the October 1954 total 2,485,160. The advance of 44,408 tons or 1.8 per cent was due mainly to heavier traffic in iron which rose to 720,973 tons from 389,174 and other freight which was up to 253,660 tons from 239,985 in the preceding October. Decreases were reported for such commodities as wheat, barley, flaxseed, bituminous coal and fuel oil. A total of 1,029 vessels of 2,201,106 registered net tons were cleared through the system as compared with the October, 1954 total of 1,112 vessels of 2,393,529 net tons.

Sault Ste. Marie Canal - Canadian and United States Locks: Although the volume of freight through the Canadian lock declined this October to 288,037 tons from 326,317, the total shipped through the combined system rose to 15,175,994 tons from 10,425,065, an advance of 4,750,929 tons or 47.5 per cent. Eastbound shipments of iron ore rose to 12,260,842 tons from 7,249,783 and other freight increased to 107,619 tons from 43,423 whereas wheat and barley shipments declined respectively to 473,417 tons from 667,468 and to 332,066 tons from 424,695. Westbound shipments of other freight rose to 147,965 tons from 102,904 while most of the other commodities decreased in volume. The total number of vessel passages increased to 2,789 from 1,846 while the total registered net tonnage rose to 12,882,895 from 8,293,930 tons in the previous October.
