## SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

## APRIL, 1955

In this report, the first for the 1955 season of navigation, a number of changes have been made in the commodity classification for the three major canal systems, the St. Lawrence, the Welland Ship and the Sault Ste. Marie. These changes have been adopted to standardize the breakdown of commodities as much as possible and to show separately, the major commodities only, transported through the canals. Changes made for the Sault Ste. Marie canal include the following: a separate breakdown of coke, lumber, copper, salt, scrap iron and structural steel has been dropped, while paper and woodpulp, and autos, trucks and parts have been added; other grain has been broken down into corn, oats, rye, barley flaxseed, and other grain and mill products; while oil and gas has been divided into gasoline, fuel oil, and, petroleum oils, and other petroleum products. Sugar was dropped from both the Welland and St. Lawrence lists while flaxseed, other grain, and mill products have been added. Petroleum and other oils has been divided into fuel oil and petroleum oils and other petroleum products. In addition, a breakdown of the traffic by direction (up or down) is shown for these two canals for the first time. Data for April, 1954 has been re-compiled on a basis comparable with the current year.

The amount of freight transported through the ten Canadian canals during the month of April totalled 2,699,072 short tons, a gain of 1,045,260 tons or 63.2 per cent over the April, 1954 total of 1,653,812 tons. Increased shipments of wheat, barley, other grains, bituminous coal and other freight through the Welland and St. Lawrence systems were mainly responsible for the significant advance over the previous April. The number of vessel passages rose appreciably to 1,796 aggregating 2,745,060 registered net tons as compared with 1,254 of 1,703,506 tons in April, 1954.

St. Lawrence Canals: The volume of freight passing through the St. Lawrence canals from the opening date of the current season, April 10th, to April 30 amounted to 635,138 tons, an increase of 290,453 tons or 84.3 per cent over the April, 1954 total of 344,685 tons. As at the Welland, this increase was due mainly to increased tonnages of wheat, barley, bituminous coal and other freight.

Welland Ship Canal: Although the Welland canal opened on March 30, five days later than in the previous year, the amount of freight traffic rose to 1,956,984 tons from 1,151,543, an increase of 805,441 tons or 69.9 per cent. Shipments of wheat advanced to 204.150 tons from 38,552 in the corresponding period of 1954; the tonnage of barley rose to 112,401 tons from 37,404; bituminous coal increased to 1,044,781 tons from 630,221; and other freight tonnage rose to 137,754 tons from 101,172. The number of vessel passages numbered 847 totalling 1,950,464 net tons as compared with 587 vessels of 1,160,291 tons in the corresponding period of 1954.

Sault Ste. Marie Canal - Canadian and United States Locks: During April, 159 vessels totalling 222,513 registered net tons transported 100,858 tons of freight through the Canadian lock at Sault Ste. Marie. In the previous April, 167 vessels of 219,348 net tons carried 151,703 tons of cargo through the lock. Decreased shipments were reported for such commodities as corn, oats, barley, and other grains, coal, pulpwood, flour and other freight. The first vessel passage was recorded on April 11th, one day later than in 1954. Freight traffic through the combined system was, however, almost double the 1954 total, advancing to 4,695,665 tons from 2,360,476 due mainly to a heavier volume of wheat, iron ore and bituminous coal.
