SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

The amount of freight transported through the eleven Canadian canals during May totalled 4,852,494 tons, an increase of 241,933 tons or 5.2 per cent over the May 1955 total of 4,610,561 tons. An increase in freight traffic was reported by the St. Lawrence and Welland Ship canals this May while a decrease was registered at the Canadian lock at Sault Ste. Marie and four of the smaller systems. Commodities responsible for the overall advance over the previous May include bituminous coal and iron ore. The number of vessel passages advanced to 3,871 from 3,668 while the registered net tonnage declined to 4,335,-770 tons from 4,520,704. The number of passengers carried this May rose to 1,396 from 1,321 while the number of pleasure craft lockages dropped to 1,214 from 2,523.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Although the volume of freight transported through the Canadian lock declined this May to 270,295 tons from 316,041, the total shipped through the combined system rose to 17,015,501 tons from 16,206,360, an advance of 809,141 tons or 5 per cent, due mainly to increased eastbound shipments of iron ore and crude oil which advanced to 12,845,090 tons from 11,868,388 and 132,522 tons from 68,812 respectively, and westbound cargoes of bituminous coal which rose to 1,549,576 tons from 1,250,507. The number of vessel passages increased to 3,049 from 2,852 while the registered net tonnage rose correspondingly to 13,330,782 tons from 12,-817,411.

Welland Ship Canal: Freight traffic cleared through the Welland Ship canal rose this May to a total of 2,834,742 tons, a gain of 153,380 tons or 5.7 per cent over the May 1955 total of 2,681,362. Commodities which contributed to the overall increase this May include: bituminous coal which totalled 731,685 tons as compared with 692,629 tons one year earlier; iron ore which advanced to 728,884 tons from 384,505; flaxseed which rose to 71,470 tons from 34,773 and fuel oil which was up to 124,143 tons from 95,647. Decreases were reported, however, for wheat, barley, pulpwood and gasoline; wheat declined to 282,-471 tons from 351,930; barley dropped to 162,691 tons from 281,107 and shipments of pulpwood decreased to 27,736 tons from 66,328. A total of 1,134 vessels, equal to 2,401,476 registered net tons, was cleared through the system as compared with the May 1955 total of 1,291 vessels of 2,552,936 net tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: The volume of freight transported through the St. Lawrence system during May amounted to 1,695,203 tons as compared with 1,553,845 tons in May 1955, a gain of 141,358 tons or 9.1 per cent. Although the tonnage of a number of commodities including barley, rye, flaxseed, and fuel oil was lower than in the previous May, an overall increase was reported as the tonnage was higher for such commodities as wheat, corn, crude oil, and considerably higher for iron ore. Wheat shipments advanced to 229,362 tons from 202,110; corn rose to 37,240 tons from 20,113; crude oil tonnage increased to 50,240 tons from 43,625 and cargoes of iron ore totalled 343,161 tons as against 86,561 in the previous May. Vessel passages numbered 1,486 aggregating 1,278,454 registered net tons as compared with 1,530 vessels of 1,342,754 net tons.
