#### SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

#### OCTOBER, 1957

The tonnage of freight transported through the Canadian canals in October decreased to 4,683,057 tons, from the October 1956, total of 5,118,784 tons, a decline of 435,727 tons or 8.5 per cent. Decreased traffic was reported by the Welland Ship, the St. Lawrence and three of the smaller canals. Lighter shipments of bituminous coal and from ore through the Welland, and wheat, barley, bituminous coal, iron ore, crude petroleum and fuel oil through the St. Lawrence canals were mainly responsible for the decrease from the previous October. The number of vessel passages dropped to 3,623 from 3,964 while the registered net tonnage fell to 4,083,979 tons from 4,567,420. A total of 1,504 pleasure craft passed through the locks as against 1,499 in October 1956, and the number of passengers carried totalled 230 as compared with 151.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Although the volume of freight cleared through the Canadian lock in October rose to 275,449 tons from 275,391 in October 1956, the total shipped through the combined system fell to 14,350,475 tons from 16,394,498, a decrease of 2,044,023 tons or 12.5 per cent. Eastbound shipments of iron ore declined to 11,330,180 tons from 13,087,974, and westbound cargoes of bituminous coal decreased to 1,132,994 tons from 1,339,567. The number of vessels and the registered net tonnage decreased to 2,626 and 11,874,880 from 2,903 and 13,632,491 respectively.

Welland Ship Canal: Total freight transported through the Welland Ship canal this October amounted to 2,711,955 tons as compared with the October 1956 total of 2,987,708. The decrease of 275,753 tons or 9.2 per cent was due mainly to lighter traffic in such commodities as wheat, barley, bituminous coal, iron ore, gasoline and fuel oil. Wheat shipments totalled 258,609 tons as compared with 277,035 tons a year earlier; barley cargoes totalled 109,045 tons as against 156,773; bituminous coal declined to 563,222 tons from 658,883; iron ore decreased to 653,473 tons from 896,721 and fuel fell to 87,577 tons from 111,812. Shipments of petroleum oils, however, rose to 85,156 tons from 46,382 and other freight to 186,323 tons from 163,448. A total of 1,152 vessels of 2,376,207 net tons was cleared through the system as compared with the October 1956 total of 1,182 vessels of 2,583,811 tons.

St. Lawrence Canals: The total volume of cargoes shipped through the St. Lawrence system during October decreased to 1,565,108 tons from 1,790,603 in October 1956, a decline of 225,495 tons or 12.6 per cent. Commodities which mainly contributed to the overall decrease were wheat which dropped to 214,227 tons from 308,291; barley which decreased to 60,719 tons from 111,224; bituminous coal which declined to 192,648 tons from 251,936 and iron ore which was down to 320,454 tons from 352,445. Heavier shipments were registered for flaxseed, petroleum oils, iron and steel products, wood pulp and other freight. Vessel passages numbered 1,404 aggregating 1,079,967 registered net tons as compared with 1,458 vessels of 1,283,697 net tons in October 1956.
