SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

August, 1958

The volume of freight transported through Canadian canals during August totalled 4,794,663 tons, down 240,852 tons or 4.8 per cent from the August 1957 total of 5,035,515 tons. Decreased freight traffic was reported at the Sault Ste. Marie, Welland Ship, St. Lawrence and five of the smaller canals. Commodities primarily responsible for the decline from the previous August were flaxseed, bituminous coal and iron ore. Vessel passages declined to 3,907 from 4,422 and total registered net tonnage to 4,224,773 tons from 4,521,318. The number of passengers carried in vessels passed through the locks rose to 61,824 from 44,497.

Sault Ste Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks

Cargoes shipped through the combined system dropped 28.7 per cent in August to 11,878,121 tons from 16,665,387 tons in August 1957. Freight traffic through the Canadian lock showed a corresponding decline to 174,614 tons from 282,263. Major factors in the combined decrease were a drop in east bound shipments of iron ore to 9,287,291 tons from 13,450,045, in east bound shipments of wheat to 314,198 tons from 531,223 and in west bound shipments of bituminous coal to 1,358,708 from 1,449,875. Vessel passages declined to 2,814 from 3,459 and total registered net tonnage of vessels to 9,348,804 tons from 13,029,806.

Welland Ship Canal:

Total freight cleared through the Welland Ship Canal amounted to 2,878,998 tons, 2.7 per cent below the 2,958,911 tons carried in August 1957. Cargoes of flaxseed fell to 47,928 tons from 122,297, bituminous coal to 641,943 tons from 737,274 and crude petroleum to 43,243 tons from 137,501. Shipments of corn, on the other hand, increased to 52,047 tons from 19,220, barley to 71,791 tons from 42,809, and sand, gravel and stone to 73,649 tons from 18,743. During the month a total of 1,221 vessels of 2,501,-796 registered net tons passed through the canal as compared with the August 1957 total of 1,239 vessels of 2,683,048 net tons.

St. Lawrence Canals:

Freight tonnage carried through the St. Lawrence Canals during August amounted to 1,640,185 tons as compared with 1,667,402 tons in August 1957, a decline of 27,217 tons or 1.6 per cent. Although tonnages of a number of commodities including wheat, corn, barley, pulpwood and other freight were higher than in the previous August, an overall decrease was recorded as flaxseed shipments fell to 47,609 tons from 105,354, iron ore to 243,399 tons from 364,939 and iron and steel to 23,963 tons from 59,695. A total of 1,327 vessels aggregating 1,662,653 registered net tons passed through the system as against 1,582 vessels of 1,166,104 net tons in August 1957.
