## SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

Freight traffic on Canadian canals totalled $4,462,996$ tons in September compared with $4,425,331$ in September 1957, the rise of 0.8 per cent being the first recorded this year. Tonnage for the year to date was down 9.5 per cent to $25,555,025$ tons from $28,232,953$ in the like period of 1957. Increased freight traffic on the Welland Ship, St. Lawrence and Canso canals was offset in part by a decrease on the Sault Ste. Marie Canal. Small increases were recorded for a number of commodities with grains predominating. Vessel passengers numbered 3873 against 3,692 in September 1957 and registered net tonnage $3,974,000$ tons versus $3,948,000$. The number of passengers in vessels locked through the canals rose to 19,464 from 11, 153.

## Sault Ste Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks:

Cargoes shipped through the combined system decreased 21.5 per cent this September to $12,045,182$ tons from $15,335,098$ in September 1957. Freight traffic through the Canadian lock registered a sharp decrease to 174,907 tons from 278,235 . The combined drop of $3,289,916$ tons was due mainly to a decline in east bound shipments of iron ore to $9,135,845$ tons from $12,178,266$ and in west bound shipments of bituminous coal to $1,237,845$ tons from $1,349,849$. Vessel passages fell to 2,273 from 2,833 and registered net tonnage of vessels to $9,400,879$ tons from $12,160,675$.

## Welland Ship Canal:

The volume of freight carried through the Welland Ship Canal totalled $2,678,406$ tons, 2.0 per cent above the $2,624,726$ tons carried in September 1957. Shipments of corn rose to 84,842 tons from 10,513 , barley to 93,555 tons from 65,232 , sand, gravel and stone to 105,094 tons from 26,290 and other manufactured products to 124,110 tons from 58,677 . A total of 1,133 vessels of $2,374,129$ registered net tons moved through the canal as compared with the September 1957 total of 1,089 vessels of 2,269,224 net tons.

## St. Lawrence Canals:

Total freight carried through the St. Lawrence Canals in September amounted to $1,481,244$ tons compared with $1,421,773$ in September 1957, a gain of 59,471 tons or 4.2 per cent. Among commodities transported in greater volume were wheat, up 55,459 tons to 209,756 ; corn, up 46,440 tons to 57,504 ; barley, up 35,352 tons to 61,042; and other freight, up 29,459 tons to 219,796. Iron ore declined 40,384 tons to 255,000 ; iron and steel, 47,869 tons to 7,338 and bituminous coal 26,144 tons to 167,407. Vessel passages rose to 1,633 from 1,408 and registered net tonnage to $1,092,593$ tons from $1,018,489$.
