SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

## April, 1960

Statistics for April cover the period between the opening of navigation on the various canals and the end of the month. For 1960 the opening dates of the three major canal systems of the St. Lawrence Seaway were as follows: Sault Ste. Marie Canal, April 4 (April 3 in 1959), Welland Ship Canal, April 1 (April 6) and St. Lawrence Canals, April 18 (April 25).

Freight transported through all Canadian canals during the month increased 52 per cent to 2,531,811 tons from 1,667,595 in April 1959. Vessel passages rose to 1,244 from 928 and the registered net tonnage was up 42 per cent, to 2,296,031 tons from 1,621,252.

Sault Ste. Marie Canals - Canadian and United States Locks: Freight cleared through the combined system in April more than doubled, rising to 6,588,954 tons from 3,219,410 in the corresponding month last year. Traffic using the Canadian lock increased to 83,900 tons from 32,262. Eastbound iron ore which constituted some 75 per cent of all freight through the combined system rose to 4,890,142 tons from 2,261,586. Wheat shipments were up to 794,447 tons from 373,674 and bituminous coal to 510,273 tons from 319,418. Total eastbound freight increased to 5,890,751 tons from 2,784,512 while westbound freight rose to 698,203 tons from 434,898. The number of vessel passages through both canals almost trebled, rising to 1,772 from 596.

Welland Ship Canal: With the earlier opening of navigation, freight through the Welland canal increased 41.5 per cent to 1,600,361 tons from 1,130,702 in April 1959. The major factors in this increase were bituminous coal shipments, up to 751,489 tons from 463,339, and iron ore, up to 271,661 tons from 114,261. Eastbound traffic increased to 1,144,110 tons from 807,338 while westbound traffic rose to 456,251 tons from 323,364. Vessel passages during the month numbered 486 with a registered net tonnage of 1,502,875 tons as against 386 vessels of 1,125,695 tons in April of last year.

St. Lawrence Canals: Freight transported through the St. Lawrence Canals in April totalled 779,280 tons compared with 467,386 tons last year. Westbound iron ore accounted for 54 per cent of the increase, rising to 209,625 tons from 40,424. Eastbound freight was up 22 per cent to 324,184 tons from 266,133 while westbound freight more than doubled, rising to 455,095 tons from 201,253. During the month 468 vessels of 618,236 registered net tons passed through the canals compared with 353 vessels of 386,915 tons in April, 1959.
