SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

JULY 1966

An analysis of July canal data revealed several important changes and developments:

The total tonnage of freight transported through all Canadian canals during July increased 6.5 per cent to 13,644,300 tons from 12,806,183 tons recorded last year.

During July, total traffic through the St. Lawrence Canals amounted to 6,236,841 tons of cargo, up 13.2 per cent or 728,550 tons from July 1965; vessel passages numbered 991 compared to 1,106 last year. The Welland Canal reported 7,122,460 tons of cargo, up 3.8 per cent or 258,118 tons over last year; vessel passages totalled 1,085 this month and 1,044 in July 1965.

Greater sales to wheat-deficient countries of the world are reflected in downbound shipments through the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals. Movements, totalling 1,595,917 tons and 1,618,467 tons respectively through the two networks, have more than doubled the volume transported during July 1965 when corresponding totals were 738,408 tons and 700,053 tons.

Downbound shipments of flaxseed during the month amounted to 75,165 tons (41,684 tons in July 1965) through the St. Lawrence Canals, and 76,676 tons (45,042 tons) through the Welland Canal.


Upbound iron ore shipments contracted to 1,637,980 tons (1,866,341 tons in July 1965) through the St. Lawrence Canals, and to 1,247,460 tons (1,842,589 tons) through the Welland Canal. A contributing factor is found in reduced loadings at Sept Îles, reflecting a machinist strike which halted movements from mining areas via railway to the port for the period from July 6 to July 22.

Shipments of fuel oil through the St. Lawrence Canals this month totalled 378,521 tons, up 55.0 per cent from the 244,177 tons carried last year. The Welland Canal reported 227,135 tons of this commodity, which represents a gain of 52.1 per cent over the July 1965 volume of 149,329 tons.

Pulpwood movements upbound through the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals were appreciably higher than July 1965. The Welland Canal reported 62,208 tons (13,401 tons in July 1965), and the St. Lawrence Canals reported 80,199 tons (32,566 tons).

For the period ending July 31, the cumulative total of cargo transported through all Canadian canals increased 12.2 per cent to 49,897,531 tons from the total of 44,455,512 tons recorded last year at this time.


