

SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

NOVEMBER 1966



An analysis of November canal data revealed several important changes and developments:

During the month, the volume of shipments through all Canadian canals increased 6.6 per cent to 14,060,470 tons from 13,195,056 tons in November 1965.

Cargo transported through the St. Lawrence Canals totalled 6,522,225 tons, 5.6 per cent higher than the 6,176,289 tons reported during November 1965. Vessel passages numbered 983 with 4,162,121 registered net tons this month compared to 1,025 vessels of 4,171,154 registered net tons in the previous year.

The Welland Canal recorded a gain of 9.5 per cent, to 7,303,062 tons from 6,667,533 tons, in the volume of cargo handled during November. Vessel activity totalled 1,023 passages of 5,123,638 registered net tons this month, and 1,104 passages of 5,070,394 registered net tons in 1965.

Downbound salt shipments through both the Welland and St. Lawrence Canal systems, at 188,470 tons and 102,480 tons respectively, more than doubled the volume transported during 1965; cumulative totals amount to 742,671 tons for the former and 436,401 tons for the latter network compared to 570,690 tons and 343,394 tons reported during the previous year.

Movements of bar, plate and structural steel products rose appreciably during the month to 488,402 tons from 313,523 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals and to 427,361 tons from 255,038 tons through the Welland Canal, reflecting industry and construction demands; this year cumulative totals for these products remain lower through the St. Lawrence Canals while surpassing the previous year's record in the case of the Welland Canal.

Soyabean shipments during November were lower than in 1965, as are the cumulative totals to date. Movements of this commodity declined to 144,791 tons from 194,113 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals, and to 204,971 tons from 251,223 tons through the Welland Canal. Gains were experienced, during both this month and this year, for certain other agricultural products; for example flaxseed shipments to the end of November through the Welland Canal totalled 569,720 tons compared to 364,560 tons in 1965.

Iron ore shipments again increased this month, to 1,767,350 tons from 1,641,144 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals and to 1,730,165 tons from 1,635,649 tons through the Welland Canal; these gains are not as great as those recorded in the previous three months. Cumulative totals for this year are almost one million tons heavier for the Welland and over two million tons greater for the St. Lawrence Canals.

For the period ending November 30, the cumulative total of cargo shipments through all Canadian canals increased 11.5 per cent to 107,707,915 tons from the 96,583,330 tons reported at this time in 1965.


