SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

MAY 1967

An analysis of May canal data revealed several important changes and developments:

The tonnage of cargo transported through the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals in May increased appreciably from that recorded during the previous month and in May 1966. A total of 7,977,064 tons was carried through the Welland Canal compared to 7,565,961 tons in May 1966, while 6,629,340 tons moved through the St. Lawrence Canals this month and 6,074,469 tons in the previous year. The cumulative tonnages are, however, somewhat lower than the traffic reported at this time in the 1966 canal season.

Bituminous coal movements through the Welland Canal rose again this month, to 1,200,847 tons from 1,058,217 tons in May 1966. Engaged in this traffic is a new Canadian laker, the "Canadian Century", which completed its maiden voyage during the month. Coal shipments through the St. Lawrence Canals fell from 184,046 tons in May 1966 to 138,153 tons this year.

Tonnages of wheat carried through both the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals more than doubled the volume reported in the previous month, and surpassed that recorded in May 1966. A total of 1,595,049 tons (1,166,315 tons in May 1966) moved through the St. Lawrence Canals, and 1,643,540 tons (1,322,981 tons) through the Welland Canal. However, due to considerably lower shipments at the beginning of the season, the April-May total remains below that of 1966.

During the month, corn shipments through the St. Lawrence Canals, totalling 174,524 tons, were markedly below those of May 1966 when 520,653 tons were carried through the system; a similar decline was experienced in Welland Canal traffic of this commodity. Reduced movements were also reported for oats and rye.

The volume of iron ore through the St. Lawrence Canals exceeded the tonnage for May 1966 by 26.2 per cent or 464,615 tons for a total of 2,238,540 tons; movements through the Welland Canal rose 8.7 per cent or 197,692 tons to 2,461,386 tons in May. The increase may be attributed to brightening prospects for steel later in the year.

The total tonnage of freight transported through all Canadian canals in May increased by 6.4 per cent to 14,799,320 tons from 13,909,077 tons in 1966.
