

SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

JULY 1967

An analysis of July canal data revealed several important changes and developments:

The total volume of freight through the St. Lawrence Canals in July declined slightly to 6,158,887 tons from 6,236,841 tons primarily because of less grain traffic. Despite a similar performance in grains through the Welland Canal, there was a gain of 4.0 per cent due to greater iron ore and coal shipments.

Downbound barley shipments through both the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals, at 318,288 tons and 302,224 tons respectively, tripled the corresponding 1966 tonnages; the cumulative figures for the year, at 950,782 tons and 883,914 tons (815,350 tons and 736,962 tons in 1966), show that this is the only grain shipped in greater quantity than the preceding year.

Iron and steel scrap destined for steel plants have been transported in appreciably greater volume through Canadian canals; for example, the St. Lawrence Canals have reported 248,467 tons cleared to the end of July compared to 50,075 tons in 1966.

Movements of fuel oil were lower this month for both the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals in contrast to most other fuels. This month, the St. Lawrence Canals, which handle the greater volume of the two networks, cleared 248,542 tons, approximately two-thirds of that recorded in July 1966; the cumulative total of 894,046 tons is some 16.1 per cent lower this year.

In July the St. Lawrence Seaway Authority and its American counterpart announced that the maximum permissible vessel draft for Seaway transit has been increased by three inches to twenty-five feet, nine inches. The new draft, a result of channel depth studies and the current favourable state of water levels on the Great Lakes, would mean greater cargo pay-loads for ships using the waterway.

The total tonnage of freight moving through all Canadian canals during July rose 2.6 per cent to 13,997,287 tons from 13,644,300 tons in 1966, while the cumulative volume handled this year to the end of the month increased to 51,393,599 tons from the 49,897,531 tons reported at the same time last year.
