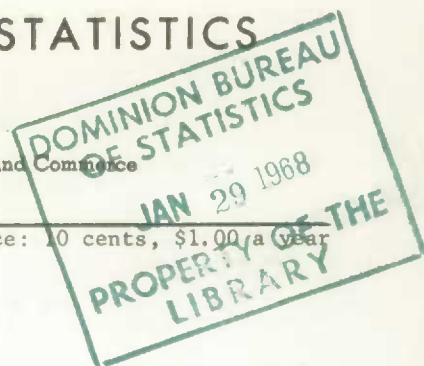

SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

AUGUST 1967

An analysis of August canal data revealed several important changes and developments.

Cargo traffic through the St. Lawrence Canals declined by 32.1 per cent to 4,360,677 tons from the 6,419,431 tons handled in August 1966; vessel passages meanwhile dropped to 819 from 989 in the previous year. The Welland Canal recorded 33.1 per cent less freight, to 5,084,857 tons from 7,601,182 tons in 1966, aboard the 772 craft (1,101 in August 1966) travelling through the system.

The Great Lakes shipping strike, involving over five thousand vessel crew, began on August 17th; the Canadian craft affected were to be brought into their terminal ports and satisfactorily docked before any walkout.

Wheat through the canals, also reflect generally reduced shipments during the season, and fell to 403,118 tons from 1,595,890 tons in August 1966 through the St. Lawrence section of the Seaway. Movements of this commodity through the Welland stood at 463,193 tons this month and 1,586,565 tons in the previous year. Cumulative tonnage through the former network totals four and a half million tons approximately two-thirds of the 1960 volume.

Iron ore, the most important commodity in terms of tonnage, declined appreciably during the month; the St. Lawrence Canals handled 503,721 tons less for a total of 1,754,714 tons, while the Welland reported only 1,555,585 tons compared to 2,466,777 tons in 1966. Cumulative totals, however, remain above that transported at this time in the previous year.

Coal downbound through the Welland Canal did not decline to the same degree as the other two dominant commodities; this month, 955,915 tons were transported against 1,109,152 tons in August 1966. A major carrier of this product was not among the firms affected by the strike.

Freight through the Canadian and American locks at Sault Ste-Marie contracted to 10,579,951 tons from 14,120,333 tons in the corresponding month of 1966; despite the month's performance, volume from the beginning of the season still exceeds that of the preceding year.

Cargo through all Canadian canals during August totalled 9,742,863 tons, almost one-third lower than last year; to the end of the month 61,136,462 tons were transported, a decline of 4.8 per cent or 3,097,463 tons from 1966.
