SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

SEPTEMBER 1967

An analysis of September canal data revealed several important changes and developments.

During the month, goods carried through the St. Lawrence Canals amounted to 3,164,701 tons, down considerably from the 6,190,000 tons reported in September 1966. Volume through the Welland Canal also dropped, to 3,647,106 tons from 7,362,554 tons in the previous year.


The shipping strike, which affected most Canadian carriers operating on the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River, began on August 17th and ended with the return of crew during the last week of September; the agreement terminating the strike was reached on September 22nd.

Due to the influences of the strike and generally lower movements through this season, wheat traffic fell to only 237,774 tons from 1,305,112 tons in the previous year through the St. Lawrence Canals. Wheat cargoes transported through the Welland Canal shrank to 204,302 tons from 1,366,609 tons in September 1966. Cumulative shipments through the Welland and St. Lawrence Canals totalled 4,780,003 tons (8,414,204 tons in 1966) and 4,781,372 tons (8,141,283 tons) respectively to the end of the month.

Movements of iron ore through the St. Lawrence Canals sank to 987,869 tons from the 2,205,398 tons recorded in September 1966. During the month, the decline in shipments through the Welland Canal was to 1,065,723 tons from 2,519,844 tons in 1966.

Among other commodities, bituminous coal decreased by one-third to 140,667 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals during September, and by over forty per cent to 547,010 tons through the Welland Canal; corn contracted to 191,538 tons from 350,924 tons in 1966 through the Welland, with a similar experience for the St. Lawrence Canals; manufactured steel, however, rose by somewhat under twenty per cent for both sections of the Seaway.

Freight through all Canadian canals during September amounted to 6,965,226 tons, approximately one-half of that moved in 1966; from the commencement of navigation, 68,101,688 tons were transported, a decline of 12.8 per cent from the 78,125,211 tons of the previous year.
