SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

DECEMBER 1967

An analysis of December canal data revealed several important changes and developments:

Freight through the St. Lawrence Canals rose by approximately one-quarter to 1,292,560 tons from 1,044,132 tons in December 1966. However, influenced by the shipping strike and lower grain movements especially, the annual cargo volume dropped to 44,167,223 tons from 49,203,262 tons for 1966. Traffic through the Welland Canal followed a similar pattern with a gain to 2,384,676 tons from 1,945,-443 tons in the corresponding month of 1966; year-end totals stood at 52,861,611 tons in 1967 and 59,-180,439 tons in the previous year.

The closing date for the St. Lawrence Canals was December 15th, the same as in 1966; the last vessels through this Section of the Seaway were the Canadian craft "Carol Lake", (downbound) and the "Hutchcliffe Hall" (upbound). The Welland closed a day later, the last transits being by the "Fort York", (downbound) and the "Sterncliffe Hall" (upbound). The Canadian lock at Sault Ste. Marie ceased 1967 operations on December 14th with the upbound passage of the American tanker "Rocket"; the U.S. locks on the St. Mary's River were open until the last day of the year.

Among commodities carried during the year, iron ore maintained premier position with 16,382,342 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals and 16,545,092 tons through the Welland; compared to 1966, this represented a gain of approximately one million tons, and a loss of eight hundred thousand tons respectively for the two waterways. Leading to this development was Hamilton docks experiencing heavier traffic of inbound Canadian ore, and an easing of American imports.

Movements of grain, notably wheat and corn, were sharply reduced in 1967. Through the St. Lawrence Canals wheat shipments sank back to 6,837,429 tons from 11,198,694 tons recorded at this time in 1966.

Of other chief commodities, lakers transporting coal through the Welland Canal were more active, handling 8,654,482 tons in 1967 against 7,686,191 tons in 1966. Fuel oil through the St. Lawrence Canals contracted by slightly over five per cent to 1,982,018 tons, although gasoline traffic rose, and steel products, mostly upbound to the United States, increased to 3,318,813 tons.

Cargoes through all Canadian canals advanced to 3,800,283 tons from 3,125,981 tons in December 1966; however, the cumulative total fell back to 98,945,276 tons from 110,833,896 tons for the preceding year, which had established a record by being the first time that cargo tonnage exceeded one hundred million tons.
