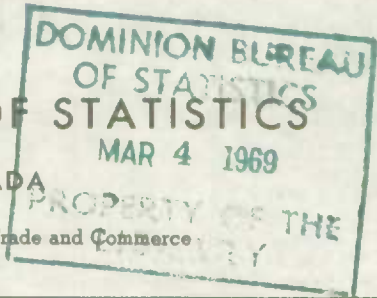

## SUMMARY OF CANAL STATISTICS

NOVEMBER 1968

During the month, cargo volume through all Canadian canals receded 4.1 per cent to 12,964,039 tons from 13,518,338 tons in November 1967. The number of vessel passages dropped by 126 to 2,100 while the registered net tonnage of these craft decreased by less than one half of one per cent for a total of 9,606,774 tons.

The St. Lawrence Canals reported a 11.4 per cent tonnage decline in November from the previous year. Of the 5,601,568 tons through the network, iron ore constituted 22.6 per cent, and its contraction from 1967 was among the prime reasons for the month's overall decrease. Due to heavier traffic this year (the cumulative total being 1.7 million tons above 1967), steel companies seem to have filled their ore requirements earlier this year, and Labrador producers are reported to have cut back pellet output in the last quarter of the year. Downbound corn shipments rose to 639,841 tons from 474,147 tons in November 1967; the United States reported near-record harvests of this commodity. Wheat activity dropped to 810,658 tons from 1,075,052 tons in the previous year, while the cumulative total of 6,218,783 tons is some four hundred thousand tons less than 1967.

Cargo traffic through the Welland Canal rose by just under one per cent to 7,039,450 tons; fewer vessels (down 54 to 869 vessels) were engaged in this transportation, although their tonnage rose to 5,393,679 registered net tons from 4,981,063 tons in 1967. Upbound iron ore fell to 1,002,453 tons from 1,463,596 tons in the previous November, but downbound volume offset this loss in large part through an increase to 427,015 tons from 117,360 tons. Among other major cargo types, coal slipped about four per cent to 1,177,279 tons, wheat by two hundred thousand tons to 908,613 tons, while corn, steel, barley and soya-beans shared the advances experienced by the St. Lawrence Canals.

Iron and steel products have been moving in record quantities through the Seaway in 1968. Various castings, bars, plate, structural shapes and pipe sum to 5,345,134 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals to the end of November, against only 3,388,385 tons in the previous year. Upbound traffic of these commodities in November through the St. Lawrence Canals totalled 698,488 tons, of which 645,986 tons continued through the Welland. Of these North American imports, 306,882 tons were loaded in Belgium, 163,152 tons in Japan, and 96,629 tons in the United Kingdom. Most of the tonnage went to the United States, Detroit receiving 283,528 tons, Chicago some 173,664 tons, while 125,459 tons were shipped to Cleveland. Roughly fifty thousand tons were destined for Canadian ports. Most of the downbound movements of 29,226 tons through the St. Lawrence Canals originated at Gary, Hamilton and Sault Ste. Marie, the larger portion being exported to Europe.

Since the commencement of navigation in April, the St. Lawrence Canals accommodated 46,343,212 tons of cargo, or 8.1 per cent over 1967, while the Welland Canal recorded vessels carrying 55,206,466 tons for a gain of 9.4 per cent. The cumulative tonnage for all Canadian canals stood at 103,580,523 tons, some 8.4 million tons over 1967 but 4.1 million less than the record year 1966.
