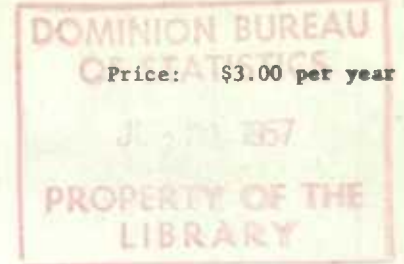

## SHIPPING STATISTICS

March, 1957



Cargo tonnage handled at Canadian ports during March, totalled 4,118,391 tons, distributed between 2,505,166 in foreign and 1,613,225 tons in coastwise service. The cumulative total for the period January - March equalled 10,989,402 tons. Of this amount 7,011,388 tons were in foreign traffic against 6,943,233 tons in the same period last year. No comparable figure is available for coastwise traffic. Unloadings in foreign service increased to 780,014 tons from 756,224 in March, 1956, a gain of 23,790 or 3.1 per cent, while loadings rose to 1,725,152 from 1,695,626 tons, up by 29,526 or 1.7 per cent. In coastwise service unloadings rose to 837,388 tons from 686,676 in March, 1956, a rise of 150,712 tons or 21.9 per cent. Loadings totalled 775,837 tons. Comparable data on 1956 loadings are not available.

The number of vessels arriving and departing in foreign and coastwise service in March, increased to 13,659, a gain of 2,060 over the 1956 total of 11,599. During March, the registered net tonnage dropped to 9,806,074 tons from 10,596,992. For the period January - March, 36,164 vessels are recorded as having arrived and departed as compared with 35,698 last year, an increase of 466 vessels.

Total cargo carried at Atlantic and St. Lawrence River ports amounted to 1,336,325 tons. Of this amount 1,080,912 tons were loaded and unloaded in foreign service while 255,413 were handled in coastwise trade. At Pacific Coast ports 190,858 tons were unloaded and 1,028,746 loaded in foreign service while coastwise service accounted for 644,635 tons unloaded and 575,790 loaded. In the Great Lakes area unloadings of 254,826 tons were reported against loadings of 87,211.

Commodities moving in greatest volume in foreign traffic included bituminous coal, 188,816 tons, crude oil, 158,562, petroleum products, 135,687 and bauxite 25,663, which accounted for more than half of the total cargo unloaded while 351,975 tons of wheat, 115,108 tons of barley, 143,199 tons of gypsum, 199,500 tons of crude oil, 109,362 tons of lumber and 119,638 tons of newsprint paper were responsible for 60.2 per cent of the total cargo loaded. In coastwise service the heaviest volume was recorded in pulpwood, petroleum products and sand and gravel.

Vancouver handled the largest cargo movement in March with a total of 1,252,191 tons. Vessels in foreign service unloaded and loaded a total of 754,967 tons as compared with 589,348 in March, 1956, an increase of 165,619 tons, while coastwise shipping at Vancouver totalled 497,224. Unloadings equalled 318,090 tons including 47,924 tons of logs, and 63,781 tons of sand and gravel. Loadings totalled 934,101 tons, wheat shipments accounting for 238,136 tons, pulpwood 116,296 tons and petroleum products for 68,650 tons. Halifax managed the second largest quantity of cargo with a total of 531,847 tons. Vessels in foreign service unloaded 243,565 tons as compared with 296,950 in March, 1956, a decrease of 53,385 tons, while loadings dropped to 204,934 from 325,294, down by 120,360 tons. In coastwise service unloadings totalled only 1,830 tons against loadings of 81,518. At Saint John, New Brunswick, a total of 114,308 tons was unloaded in foreign service, while 271,197 tons were loaded. Total cargoes loaded and unloaded in coastwise service amounted to 58,357 tons. New Westminster reported 223,123 tons in foreign and coastwise service. Unloadings in foreign service amounted to 5,001 tons as compared with 1,244 in March, 1956, an increase of 3,757 tons, while loadings dropped to 77,433 from 110,367 down by 32,934 tons. Coastwise traffic totalled 140,689 tons. At Sarnia a total of 46,614 tons was unloaded and 65,171 loaded, while Toronto reported unloadings of 33,140 tons and loadings of 10,500 tons. Hamilton handled a total of 34,991 tons for the month.

**NOTE:** Beginning with the year 1957 statistics are being collected from vessels in coastwise service departing from non-customs ports.
