SHIPPING STATISTICS

APRIL, 1957

With the opening of navigation on the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River, cargoes handled at Canadian ports in April rose to 10,890,074 tons from 4,118,391 in the previous month. This tonnage was divided between 5,642,995 tons in foreign and 5,247,079 in coastwise service. The cumulative total for the period January-April amounted to 21,879,476 tons. Of this amount 12,654,383 tons were handled in foreign service against 12,837,527 tons in the same period last year. No comparable figure is available for coastwise trade. Unloadings in foreign service increased to 3,107,078 tons from 2,806,840 in April, 1956, a gain of 300,238 or 10.7 per cent, while loadings dropped to 2,535,917 from 3,087,454 tons, down by 551,537 or 17.9 per cent. In coastwise service unloadings fell to 2,510,434 tons from 2,734,035 in 1956, a decrease of 223,601 tons or 8.2 per cent. Loadings equalled 2,736,645 tons. Comparable data on 1956 loadings are not available.

The number of vessels arriving and departing in foreign and coastwise service in April increased to 18,393 from 16,652 in April, 1956, while the registered net tonnage dropped to 19,349,123 from 20,144,690. For the period January-April 54,557 vessel arrivals and departures were recorded, an increase of 2,207 over the 1956 total of 52,350.

At Atlantic and St. Lawrence River ports 1,430,777 tons were unloaded and 2,042,645 loaded in foreign and coastwise service. Pacific Coast ports reported unloadings of 239,892 tons against loadings of 828,045 in foreign service while a total of 1,178,217 tons was handled in coastwise traffic. In the Great Lakes area 2,116,017 tons were unloaded and 254,183 loaded in foreign service, while coastwise service accounted for 1,178,131 tons unloaded and 1,622,167 loaded.

The heavier unloadings in foreign service included bituminous coal, petroleum products and bauxite. More than half of the total cargo loaded was made up of iron ore (374,815), gypsum, (340,055), wheat, (338,347), crude oil, (114,500), lumber, (148,933) and newsprint paper (220,269). In coastwise service the greater volume of shipping was recorded in wheat, iron ore, petroleum products, gasoline, sand and gravel. These commodities accounted for 63.6% of total cargo handled.

Vancouver handled 961,135 tons in April, the largest cargo movement of any port in Canada. Vessels in foreign service accounted for a total of 620,914 tons as compared with 608,931 in the previous year, while coastwise shipping totalled 340,221 tons for the month. Montreal had the second largest cargo movement with a total of 884,743 tons. Vessels in foreign service unloaded 220,083 tons as compared with 178,573 in April, 1956, an increase of 41,510 tons, while loadings dropped to 159,449 from 282,663 tons, down by 123,214. In coastwise service vessels unloaded 202,266 tons against 302,945 loaded. Hamilton stood in third place with a cargo movement of 804,098 tons. A total of 709,941 tons was unloaded in foreign service, bituminous coal accounting for 634,020 tons or 89.3 per cent. Cargoes handled in coastwise service totalled 94,156 tons. Port Arthur reported 667,432 tons for the month. Loadings equalled 651,587 tons including 491,667 tons of wheat, 63,972 tons of barley, 24,515 tons of oats and 37,072 tons of iron ore. Cargoes unloaded amounted to 15,845 tons. Toronto recorded total unloadings of 467,581 tons against loadings of 91,477. At Saint John, New Brunswick, a total of 87,292 tons was unloaded in foreign service, while 345,482 were loaded. Cargoes in coastwise service totalled 34,801 tons. Sarnia loaded and unloaded a total of 424,271 tons in foreign and coastwise service, wheat shipments accounting for 65,212, bituminous coal 89,651, petroleum products 119,468 and gasoline 43,850. At Port Colborne a total of 255,510 was unloaded and 108,851 loaded, while Fort William reported unloadings of 14,736 and loadings of 349,441 tons. Port Alfred handled 296,039 tons for the month, shipments of bauxite accounting for 194,137 tons.

NOTE: Beginning in 1957, statistics are being collected from vessels in coastwise service departing from non-customs ports.
