

SHIPPING STATISTICS

January, 1958

The total volume of freight handled at Canadian ports during January amounted to 2,942,440 tons, a decrease of 615,249 tons or 17.3 per cent from the January 1957 total of 3,557,689 tons. In foreign trade loadings were down 10.9 per cent to 1,656,064 tons and unloadings 15.5 per cent to 459,803 tons. In coastal trade the decline was even more pronounced with loadings off 35.3 per cent to 384,935 tons and unloadings down 21.0 per cent to 441,638 tons. Vessel arrivals and departures in both services totalled 9,184 as against 11,399 in January 1957 while registered net tonnage dropped to 6,919,919 tons from 10,495,608 with most of the decrease occurring in coastal service.

Commodities loaded in greatest volume in foreign trade were wheat, gypsum, lumber and general. Offsetting an increase of 121,962 tons in the amount of wheat loaded were a drop of 145,000 tons in shipments of crude petroleum and other large decreases in general cargo, gypsum and barley. As a result there was a net decline of 203,466 tons from the previous January in the amount of cargo destined to foreign ports. Contributing to a drop of 84,532 tons in receipts from foreign ports were mainly petroleum oils and products, crude petroleum and general cargo. Bauxite recorded an increase.

In coastal trade the greatest volume of shipping was recorded in petroleum products, sand, gravel and crushed stone and general. Although unloadings of sand, gravel and crushed stone, and petroleum oils and products were higher than in the previous January sizeable decreases in iron ore, pulpwood and general cargo resulted in an overall decline this January of 117,227 tons.

As compared with January 1957, cargo loaded at Atlantic and lower St. Lawrence River ports declined 17.7 per cent to 896,498 tons and at Pacific coast ports 16.5 per cent to 1,134,089 tons. In the Atlantic region unloadings fell 16.1 per cent to 468,969 tons and in the Pacific area 20.5 per cent to 432,465 tons. Traffic on the Great Lakes was negligible in January of both years as a result of winter freeze-up.

Canadian ports registering the greatest volume of cargo handled during January were: Vancouver, 869,838 tons (998,695 in January 1957); Halifax, 523,707 tons (645,807); and Saint John, 347,923 tons (315,831).
