



INTRODUCTION

This publication contains statistics on the commodities loaded for and unloaded from foreign countries at Canadian ports. Data are also given on the number and registered net tonnage of vessels arrived at and departed from Canadian ports in international seaborne shipping.

Source

Shipping statistics are compiled from reports made by operators or agents of vessels which arrive at and depart from Canadian ports. With the exception of vessels of less than fifteen registered net tons, naval vessels, and fishing vessels, all vessels are required to complete "Shipping Reports". At ports where there are customs officers these officials act as agents for the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in collecting the reports and forwarding them to the Bureau. The reports which record the activity at non-customs ports are forwarded through the nearest customs office.

The co-operation of shipping operators, shipping agents, and the Customs and Excise Division of the National Revenue Department in collecting the statistics contained in this publication has continued to be excellent.

Treatment of Data

Only data relating to those vessels which are engaged in port-to-port transportation of goods and/or passengers for compensation have been included. Intra-port movements have been excluded.

A vessel is classed as being in foreign service when (1) it arrives from a foreign port as last port of call, or departs for a foreign port as first port of call; or (2) cargo is loaded for a foreign port, or unloaded from a foreign port; or (3) the registry of the vessel is other-than-Canadian or British Commonwealth (even though the vessel may have arrived at one Canadian port from another, or departed from one Canadian port for another).

A vessel is classed as being in coasting service when (1) it is of Canadian or British Commonwealth registry; and (2) it arrives at one Canadian port from another, or departs from one Canadian port for another; and (3) it unloads no freight from a foreign port, or loads no freight for a foreign port; or (4) it is of foreign registry, but is granted a waiver to engage in coasting service.

A vessel from a foreign port calling at two Canadian ports with foreign freight for the second port will be in foreign and out coasting at the first port and in foreign at the second port. Also, a vessel calling at two Canadian ports on a voyage to a foreign port and having loaded freight at the first port for a foreign port is out foreign at the first port and in coasting and out foreign at the second port. A vessel calling at several Canadian ports with final destination a foreign port is in coasting service into each port. It also is in coasting service out of each port, except the last unless freight for a foreign port is loaded. Because of the variety that is possible in vessel movements, the number of arrivals and departures in either international seaborne shipping or coastwise shipping will not always be the same.

Beginning the count of vessel arrivals and departures on January 1 and ending it on December 31 also causes a disparity in the number of arrivals and departures. Those vessels which arrive in December and depart in January of the next year will be counted only as departures in the statistics of the year in which they depart. Similarly, those vessels which arrive in December and depart in January of the next year will be counted only as arrivals in the statistics of the year in which they arrive.

If a vessel does not unload any freight, or does not load any freight, it is classed as arriving or departing, respectively, "in ballast", regardless of the amount of cargo it might have on board.

Appendix A is a list of the Canadian ports for which shipping data are tabulated separately. This list is derived from the names assigned to the areas of loading or unloading by the respondents. Because of space limitations, data for the complete list of ports is not published in either Part II or Part III of the *Shipping Report*. Those ports for which data are not published separately are designated in the appendix. Information on these ports can be obtained by forwarding a request to the Chief, Transportation and Public Utilities Section, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Ottawa.

Appendix B is the list of commodities into which all cargoes which are loaded or unloaded at Canadian ports are grouped. This list is based on the *Standard Commodity Classification Manual* published by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

Because of space limitations, the description of the commodities which are listed in the tables are often abbreviated or incomplete. Reference to Appendix B, however, will enable users to obtain the complete description.

Also because of space limitations, the headings in the list of commodities have been excluded from the tables. The commodities, however, are listed in the tables in the same order as they appear in Appendix B.

The term "general cargo" which appears in the list of commodities refers to only those commodities which are not identified in the "Shipping Reports" as specific commodities. The term is not intended to indicate the distinction between bulk and other commodities.

The letters "n.e.s." which are found in the commodity listing mean "not elsewhere specified".

It should be noted that, because of corrections made throughout the year, the figures contained in

this publication will differ from those released as preliminary data in the monthly *Shipping Statistics*.

Because of shrinkage and other reasons, loading and unloading figures for a particular commodity do not always agree. For statistical purposes, however, they are required to be the same.

Some ports are heavily engaged in "lightering". In cases where cargo was loaded or unloaded in a port, but in the harbour rather than at a dock or wharf, the cargo is included with the port totals. Where transhipments were made outside a harbour, or at mid-stream, the cargo handled is treated as a loading or unloading at the nearest port. The ports which have lightered commodities included in their totals are: Botwood, Goose Bay, Charlottetown, Bathurst, Campbellton, Chatham, Rimouski, Chicoutimi, Trois-Rivières, Varennes, and Port Stanley.

ANALYSIS OF DATA

In 1965 several significant changes were evident in the statistics which measure international seaborne shipping activity at Canadian ports:

Cargo handled in international seaborne shipping at Newfoundland ports rose by 492,977 tons or 15.6 per cent to 3,643,142 tons during 1965. Bell Island, handling almost one third of this total, increased its loadings of iron ore to 1,152,306 tons, compared to 956,884 tons shipped in 1964. At Corner Brook, which handled 594,453 tons (551,372 tons in 1964), newsprint paper loadings, although slightly lower than last year, remained dominant. St. John's handled only 278,061 tons (515,995 tons in 1964) reflecting a decline in crude petroleum unloadings to 105,219 tons from 341,125 tons in the previous year.

Prince Edward Island ports recorded a gain of 78,663 tons or 76.3 per cent over 1964; Charlottetown, handling 119,633 tons (37,236 tons in 1964), mainly fuel oil, accounted for almost two thirds of the provincial total of 181,762 tons.

The volume of cargo handled at ports in Nova Scotia declined slightly to 11,602,746 tons from 11,669,880 tons in 1964. During the year, cargo moving through Halifax rose by 316,405 tons to 6,944,594 tons; tonnages of wheat handled at this port contracted to 462,831 tons (555,933 tons in 1964), while fuel oil expanded to 686,540 tons (434,478 tons in 1964). Loadings of gypsum at Hantsport declined to 1,992,061 tons from 2,206,957 tons, causing the port's tonnage handled to total 221,137 tons lower than last year.

At Sydney, the volume of cargo handled was 59,374 tons less than the 998,644 tons reported last year; iron ore unloadings amounted to 335,318 tons compared to 397,595 tons in 1964. The gypsum loadings published this year at Little Narrows, were

previously included with tonnages at Baddeck. Reduced loadings of this commodity at Port Hawkesbury were chiefly responsible for lowering that port's tonnage handled to 708,508 tons (808,829 tons in 1964).

New Brunswick ports handled 305,579 tons or 5.8 per cent more cargo than in 1964 for a total of 5,543,657 tons, of which 4,220,155 tons crossed the docks at Saint John. While the tonnages handled at this port increased only marginally (13,593 tons), the commodity composition varied considerably over the two years. Wheat shipments rose to 633,064 tons from 563,324 tons, while no fertilizer and fertilizer materials were loaded during the year compared to 112,573 tons in 1964. Dalhousie handled 200,312 tons or 39.7 per cent more cargo than the previous year for a total of 704,716 tons due mainly to an expansion of 169,200 tons, to 277,754 tons, in loadings of zinc ore and concentrates.

During the year Quebec ports handled 57,751,543 tons of cargo, representing an increase of 2,263,611 tons or 4.1 per cent over the previous year. Greater tonnages of corn (1,750,353 tons in 1965 compared to 1,462,797 tons in 1964) and soya beans (640,054 tons and 444,334 tons in 1965 and 1964 respectively) were handled at Baie Comeau, where the volume of cargo rose 536,481 tons or 9.7 per cent to 6,039,935 tons. Montreal handled 606,125 tons more cargo during 1965 for a total of 12,586,001 tons. Appreciable changes were noted for fuel oil, 2,227,062 tons handled (1,502,606 tons in 1964), crude petroleum, 2,174,413 tons (1,461,280 tons), wheat, 2,524,999 tons (2,870,741 tons) and soya beans, 164,996 tons (430,165 tons).

Tonnages published this year for Pointe Noire were previously included with Sept-Iles, which consequently shows less tonnage than last year.

Shipments from Port Cartier were lower this year due to a decline in iron ore loadings; 9,093,794 tons were shipped in 1965 compared to 10,137,504 tons in 1964. Cargo handled at Quebec rose 597,823 tons or 23.6 per cent to 3,126,943 tons in 1965. Fuel oil unloading totalled 918,973 tons (569,270 tons in 1964), while the volume of corn handled rose to 310,451 tons (49,530 tons); these increases outweighed certain commodity declines, such as wheat which dropped to 554,721 tons (647,117 tons). Trois-Rivières handled 3,316,735 tons of cargo in 1965, up 350,752 tons or 11.8 per cent. Tonnages of grain increased somewhat, but the major increases were recorded for soya beans, up 151,568 tons to 423,286 tons, and fuel oil, up 76,438 tons to 452,055 tons.

During 1965, ports in Ontario handled 33,322,774 tons of cargo moving in international seaborne shipping, compared to 32,833,896 tons in 1964. Hamilton, handling 8,046,696 tons of cargo, mainly iron ore and bituminous coal, accounted for almost one quarter of all cargo transported to and from Ontario ports in international seaborne shipping. Port Arthur - Fort William handled 4,105,980 tons this year and 4,463,946 tons in 1964. Iron ore loadings fell 699,264 tons to 2,433,965 tons, and wheat, barley and rye loadings also declined. However, certain commodities recorded gains during the year, for example: loadings of oats up 152,552 tons to 171,617 tons, flaxseed loadings up 119,232 tons to 201,701 tons, and bituminous coal unloadings up 135,050 tons to 232,074 tons.

At Toronto the volume of cargo expanded to 4,079,990 tons, representing an increase of 370,011 tons or 10.0 per cent over the previous year. This resulted chiefly from unloading of bituminous coal rising 312,072 tons to 2,396,528 tons. Sault Ste. Marie reported 3,934,480 tons handled, down 231,008 tons from 1964. The decline may be traced to lesser unloading of iron ore, down 164,681 tons to 841,831 tons, and limestone, down 55,457 tons to 547,730 tons.

The volume of cargo, mainly wheat destined for Europe, handled at Churchill rose 69,819 tons or 10.1 per cent to 761,024 tons during the year.

Ports in British Columbia handled 22,983,513 tons during 1965, an increase of 1,068,801 tons or 4.9 per cent over the previous year. Vancouver received and shipped a total of 11,357,798 tons compared to 11,589,340 tons in 1964. Wheat shipments, destined mainly for Asian countries declined by 650,841 tons to 3,688,822 tons during the year; barley loadings also contracted, by 167,303 tons, to a total of 464,991 tons. Other commodities handled at this port increased in volume: fertilizer and fertilizer materials up 335,311 tons to a total of 778,894 tons, and lumber and timber, up 152,356 tons to 1,354,703 tons.

The volume of cargo handled at Victoria amounted to 1,149,892 tons compared to 1,499,280 tons last year. Loadings of wheat expanded 54,860 tons to 301,387 tons while loadings of pulpwood fell to 189,361 tons from 419,879 tons in 1964, and lumber and timber declined to 400,984 tons from 607,382 tons.

New Westminster handled 1,215,478 tons of cargo compared to 1,389,501 tons in 1964. Loadings of lumber and timber fell to 515,071 tons from 602,444 tons and pulpwood to 22,490 tons from 93,994 tons. Port Alberni handled 811,094 tons this year and 637,129 tons last year. Gains were recorded for loadings of lumber and timber, up 46,836 tons to 382,502 tons, and newsprint paper, up 71,935 tons to 255,448 tons.

During 1965 a number of noteworthy changes occurred in the volume and composition of cargo handled at certain Great Lakes ports, and transported via the St. Lawrence River to or from foreign countries:

Crude petroleum unloaded at Clarkson increased to 97,384 tons from 13,896 tons in 1964, while none was unloaded at Port Credit compared to 68,643 tons in 1964. At Hamilton the tonnage of cargo unloaded, at 449,751 tons, almost doubled (226,525 tons in 1964); fuel oil (up 72,701 tons to 109,261 tons), steel bars and rods (up 90,806 tons to 102,971 tons) and steel plate and sheet (up 80,870 tons to 89,989 tons) are chiefly responsible for the increase.

Cargo shipped via the St. Lawrence from Port Arthur - Fort William totalled 890,425 tons, up considerably from 1964 when only 574,259 tons were shipped; appreciable increases were noted in loadings of oats at 166,912 tons (19,065 tons in 1964), and flaxseed at 201,701 tons (82,469 tons in 1964). At Toronto this year 1,025,754 tons of cargo, transported from other countries via the St. Lawrence, were unloaded compared to 697,731 tons in 1964; loadings declined to 245,936 tons from 418,500 tons this year mainly because of iron and steel scrap (6,403 tons in 1965 and 138,662 tons in 1964). Those commodities chiefly responsible for increased unloading were raw sugar (125,487 tons this year compared to 94,898 tons in 1964), fuel oil (283,438 tons in 1965 and 118,606 tons in 1964) and general cargo (320,641 tons in 1965 and 269,923 tons in 1964).
