

WATER TRANSPORTATION 1961

INTRODUCTION

This report deals primarily with the financial aspects of the water transportation industry in Canada. Statistics on Canada's waterborne commerce, including the volume of freight carried by Canadian vessels in both international and coastwise shipping are contained in the "Shipping Report", Parts I, II and III, also published by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. In 1961, according to the Shipping Report, vessels of Canadian registry transported 25.3 million short tons, or 27.2 per cent of the 92.9 million tons of cargo loaded and unloaded at Canadian ports in international seaborne or foreign shipping. This includes traffic to and from the United States across the Great Lakes. In coastwise shipping, Canadian vessels carried 39.5 million tons or 85.0 per cent of a total of 46.4 million tons unloaded. While statistics of freight carried on inland rivers and lakes other than the Great Lakes are not available, it may be presumed that all freight on these waters was carried in vessels of Canadian registry.

Source and Treatment of Data

The data presented in this report relate to the common carrier activities of vessels operating under Canadian registry. Operators engaged solely in the fishing or lumbering trades and others who make separate reports to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics including vessel operations as a part of their particular industry are excluded. Private pleasure craft are also excluded.

A total of 314 operators submitted reports for 1961. This represented almost the entire water transportation industry in Canada, the majority of those not reporting being small operators with one or two vessels engaged in restricted or seasonal activities. Of the total reporting, 239 were incorporated companies, while 75 were individual owners or partnerships. For the year 1960, a total of 337 returns were received, 241 from incorporated companies and 96 from individual owners or partnerships.

The statistics in this report are presented on the basis of four geographical regions. The Atlantic division comprises the Atlantic provinces, the eastern seaboard and the St. Lawrence River up to and including Montreal; the Great Lakes division includes the St. Lawrence River above Montreal and the Great Lakes; the Pacific division embraces the west coast ports, while the Inland division includes the MacKenzie River and all other inland lakes and

waterways. The completed returns are allocated to one of these areas in accordance with the area served by the majority of the vessels as reported by the operator. The 1961 returns included 150 for the Atlantic division, 109 for the Pacific, 39 for the Great Lakes and 16 for the Inland division.

Vessels

Reports from Canadian water transportation companies show the total number of vessels in operation during the year as 2,121 compared with 2,144 in 1960. Of these, 1,597 were owned and 524 chartered, as against 1,636 owned and 508 chartered in the previous year. An additional 116 vessels were reported as "not operated" during the year. Of the total vessels in service, the Pacific division reported 1,053 (1,017 in 1960), the Atlantic division reported 605 (636), the Great Lakes division 234 (239), and the Inland division 229 (252).

Property

For companies reporting in 1961, the total value of property, before depreciation, increased 1.5 per cent to \$524,203,743 from \$516,274,841 in 1960, with the value of vessels increasing to \$471,502,907 from \$469,972,282. The net value of property after depreciation increased 1.3 per cent to \$281,743,551 from \$277,806,874. The Pacific division was up 21.1 per cent to \$69,020,311 from \$56,987,839 and the Great Lakes division up 5.8 per cent to \$112,148,897 from \$105,992,353 while the Atlantic division decreased 12.3 per cent to \$97,158,237 from \$110,775,060 and the Inland division was down 15.7 per cent to \$3,416,106 from \$4,051,662. It should be noted that the property value quoted for 1960 contains revisions, due mainly to the elimination of vessels wrongly reported in that year.

Income Account

Total operating revenues declined to \$312,123,246 from \$316,307,290 in the previous year and the gross income dropped to \$324,286,402 from \$331,242,151. All divisions except the Great Lakes showed decreases. Passenger revenues were down in all but the Inland division with the total down 5.2 per cent to \$15,879,365 from \$16,751,619. Freight revenue declined to \$239,490,673 from \$241,911,797. Increases in the Great Lakes and Pacific divisions were offset by a drop of \$10.7 million in the Atlantic division. Revenue from towing was down 11.0 per cent to \$27,825,195 from \$31.376.577. Most of this decrease was in the

Pacific division which declined 13.5 per cent to \$23,269,222 from \$26,912,770. Charter revenue showed an overall gain of 16.9 per cent to \$17,528,638 from \$14,989,640 while minor increases were recorded in salvage and storage revenue.

Although cost of maintenance and rentals was somewhat lower than in the previous year other operational costs showed increases and total expenses rose to \$316,925,590 from \$316,248,391. This increase was all in the Great Lakes division where expenses were up 6.1 per cent to \$77,273,636 from \$72,815,830 in 1960. Other divisions showed decreases. In the Atlantic division total expenses were reduced to \$169,083,602 from \$171,635,709; in the Pacific division to \$66,277,626 from \$66,863,644; and in the Inland division to \$4,290,726 from \$4,933,208.

After provision for income tax the industry showed an overall loss of \$1,686,489 as against a profit of \$5,467,644 in 1960. Increased profits were recorded in the Great Lakes division, up 9.1 per cent to \$9,249,658 from \$8,478,047, in the Pacific division, up 1.7 per cent to \$4,367,599 from \$4,293,778 and in the Inland division, up to \$323,753 from \$94,985. In the Atlantic division, however, the year's operations resulted in a deficit of \$15,627,499 compared with a deficit of \$7,399,166 in the previous year.

Employees and Earnings

Although the total number of employees dropped to 21,775 from 22,481 in 1960, salaries and wages paid in the water transportation industry rose to \$80,758,104 from \$78,138,884.

In addition to salaries and wages, employees received free board valued at \$4,409,757 compared with \$4,469,065 in the previous year and free lodging for which no valuation was made. Withdrawals by owner-operators declined to \$143,740 from \$159,892 in 1960.

The average annual wage for vessel crews increased 7.6 per cent to \$3,980 from \$3,696 while

the average annual wage for dock and warehouse employees increased 6.7 per cent to \$5,004 from \$2,815.

Although the average annual earnings in some cases may appear relatively low it should be noted that a considerable portion of the water transportation industry operates on a seasonal basis, particularly on the Great Lakes where the period of navigation is normally eight months or less and, consequently, average earnings are not representative of a full year's employment. When the value of meals, lodging and monthly wages are combined, Canadian crews have incomes second only to those of the United States.

Fuel Consumption and Cost

Expenditures on fuel declined to \$27,160,246 from \$27,364,690 in 1960 due mainly to a lower consumption of coal and fuel oil. The consumption of coal dropped to 372,861 tons from 440,567 with fuel oil down to 186,863,774 gallons from 191,626,858. The consumption of diesel oil increased to 78,993,035 gallons from 58,850,898 while gasoline showed little change at 471,341 gallons.

All fuels were down in cost. Coal averaged \$11.43 a ton compared with a revised figure of \$11.46 in the previous year. Diesel oil dropped to 12.4 cents a gallon from 14.5 cents, fuel oil declined to 6.8 cents a gallon from 7.1 cents and gasoline to 29.3 cents a gallon from 29.5 cents.

Accidents

During 1961, accidents in the water transportation industry resulted in 18 deaths and 1,886 injuries as compared with 10 deaths and 1,746 injuries in 1960. No passengers were killed but 50 were injured as against 1 killed and 59 injured in 1960. Accidents to crew resulted in 16 killed and 1,229 injured as compared with 7 killed and 1,156 injured in the previous year.

Ten vessels valued at \$233,736 were lost during the year as against eight vessels valued at \$637,683 in the preceding year.
