



WATER TRANSPORTATION

1962

This publication presents statistics on the Canadian for-hire water transportation industry, which is made up of common and contract carriers. These carriers are defined as persons engaged primarily in the business of transporting passengers or goods by water for compensation. Companies which transport their own goods in their own vessels as an integral part of total operations are not included in this definition. The owners and operators of fishing vessels and pleasure craft are also excluded.

During 1962 a review of the reporting forms used to collect the data contained in this publication and a review of the form of presentation of this data were undertaken. The Canadian Shipowners Association co-operated in these reviews, which were designed to increase the usefulness of the published statistics. As a result, three major changes have been made in this year's publication, compared to Water Transportation, 1961.

The first major change has been to group water transportation carriers by revenue class, which facilitates comparison with the carriers of other modes of transportation, which are also grouped by revenue class. In the 1961 publication water transportation carriers were grouped according to type of organization.

The second of the major changes has been to re-define the division of carriers which was used in 1961. The new divisions, as defined below, segregate domestic carriers from international carriers, and, by introducing the concept of "fresh waters", better organize domestic carriers.

The third major change has been to use a different standard for the count of vessels. In 1961 the count was made according to operation; in 1962 the count has been made according to ownership, in order to more accurately reflect the significance of vessel charters.

To facilitate comparison of 1961 and 1962 data, the previous year's figures have been re-compiled on the bases used for the presentation of this year's figures.

The carriers included in this publication are grouped into three classes according to annual operating revenues, as follows:

Data for each of these revenue classes are presented on the basis of a separation of the carriers into four divisions:

Each of the carriers included in this publication is allotted to one of these four divisions, according to the geographical region served by the majority of the vessels operated by the carrier:

- (1) The Atlantic division is made up of those carriers whose principal region of operation is the waters adjacent to the Atlantic Coast and that portion of the St. Lawrence River which is east of "inland waters".
- (2) The Inland division consists of all carriers whose principal region of operation is in "inland waters", which is defined by the Canada Shipping Act as being all rivers, lakes, and other navigable fresh waters within Canada. "Inland waters" includes the St. Lawrence River as far seaward as a straight line drawn from Cap des Rosiers to West Point, Anticosti Island, and from Anticosti Island to the north shore of the St. Lawrence River along the meridian of longitude sixty-three degrees west.
- (3) The Pacific division is made up of those carriers whose principal region of operation is the waters adjacent to the Pacific Coast.
- (4) The Ocean-going division consists of all carriers who engage in world-wide trade.

SUMMARY

Changes in Statistics

In 1962 there were significant changes in several of the statistics relating to the total of Class I and Class II revenue groups:

The 1962 count of owned vessels and vessels of non-Canadian registry chartered from others totalled 1,489. An additional 69 vessels were reported as inactive. The 1961 total of 1,674 was made

up of owned vessels and vessels of Canadian and non-Canadian registry chartered from others. In addition, 86 vessels were reported as inactive.

After provision for income tax, Class I and Class II revenue groups recorded a loss of \$8,701,768, compared to a loss of \$1,962,273 in 1961. This increase was largely accounted for by the amount of accelerated depreciation which was taken on the cost of new vessels.

The quantity of coal consumed as fuel continued to decline, because of the trend toward the use of diesel oil and fuel oil. Engines using these oils utilize a higher percentage of the thermal energy of their fuel, which can be stored in less space. Coal consumed as fuel in 1962 amounted to 311,645 tons, compared with 372,172 tons in 1961.

The value of property, before depreciation, increased 9.2 per cent from the \$519,989,437 recorded in 1961. This percentage increase was mainly accounted for by the value of vessels and floating equipment, which increased to \$512,518,233 from \$467,794,920. The greatest absolute increase in property value, which was accounted for by new vessels, was recorded in the Inland division.

Five vessels, valued at \$2,398,650, were totally lost during the year, compared with the 9 vessels valued at \$183,888 which were totally lost

in 1961. The loss of one large vessel accounted for most of this increase in value.

In 1962 there were two significant changes relating to the Class III revenue group:

The number of vessels increased by 40 over the 1961 count, because of an increase in the number of tow barges and scows in operation in the Pacific division.

There was a very pronounced change from the use of gasoline to the use of diesel oil as fuel.
