

INTRODUCTION

This publication presents financial, employment and operating statistics on firms comprising the Canadian water transportation industry.

Source

Statistics Canada has compiled a list of companies and individuals engaged in the water transportation industry to form the basis of the annual Water Transportation Survey. Establishments reporting fall under Industry No. 504 of the Standard Industrial Classification. The owners and operators of fishing vessels and pleasure craft are excluded in this survey.

Treatment of Data

In this publication, establishments are divided into three major categories:

For-hire carriers, both common and contract, are Canadian incorporated companies or individuals engaged primarily in the business of transporting passengers or goods by water for compensation. These carriers may operate self-owned and/or chartered vessels, and are presented in Tables 1 through 18.

Owners leasing vessels under bareboat charter, are also Canadian domiciled and charter their vessels to others for an agreed period of time and with a transfer of the management responsibility over the ship, its manning, use and operating requirements. Statistics relating to this category form Tables 19, 20 and 21.

Private carriers are defined as an operating division of a firm or conversely a separately incorporated company which serves primarily to transport the goods of the parent firm as an integral part of total operations. Information detailing this category is contained in the final pages of this publication, commencing with Table 22.

The for-hire carriers are classed according to annual operating revenue as follows:

Class I - Operating revenues over \$500,000.

Class II - Operating revenues between \$50,000 and \$500,000.

Class III — Operating revenues under \$50,000.

Each of the establishments included in the for-hire and private categories is allocated to a geographical division in accordance with the region served by all or the majority of the vessels operated by the carrier:

The Atlantic Division is made up of those carriers whose principal region of operation is the waters adjacent to the Atlantic Coast and that portion of the St. Lawrence River which is east of "inland waters".

The Inland Division consists of all carriers whose principal region of operation is the "inland waters", which is defined by the Canadian Shipping Act as being all rivers, lakes and other navigable fresh waters within Canada, including the St. Lawrence River as far seaward as a straight line drawn:

(a) from Cap des Rosiers to West Point, Anticosti Island, and

(b) from Anticosti Island to the north shore of the St. Lawrence River along the meridian of longitude sixty-three degrees west.

The Pacific Division is made up of those carriers whose principal region of operation is the waters adjacent to the Pacific Coast.

The Ocean-going Division consists of all carriers who engage in world-wide trade.

ANALYSIS OF DATA

For-hire Carriers

In 1970, the operating revenues of the companies covered by this report rose substantially to \$469 million compared with \$402 million in 1969. Contributory factors were a shipping season free from major strikes and a recovered world market for grains. The reported net income before income taxes was \$31,671,438 compared with \$15,409,192 in 1969.

The operating revenues for Class I carriers accounted for most of the increase, in dollar terms up 16.6 per cent to \$445,880,566. Class II experienced an even larger percentage increase, up 26 per cent, to \$21,970,802. By Division, the improved level of activity manifested itself most in "Inland", followed by "Oceangoing". Subsidies to all for-hire carriers rose to \$35,147,083 in 1970 compared with \$29,315,802 in 1969.

At the end of the year, for-hire carriers had an original investment of \$708,558,054, and after depreciation, reported \$416,135,024 as the value for the vessels and other facilities contributing to their operations. Net income in terms of this value after depreciation was 7.6 per cent before income taxes, compared to 3.5 per cent in 1969. Additions to fleets was reported as \$33,120,497 compared with \$54,044,060 in 1969. However, a certain amount of this sum went to purchase existing craft from other owners, this being partially reflected in the \$31,705,632 figure reported for vessel retirements.

A major cost element every year is labour. In 1970, it stood at \$124,062,278 or 26 per cent of operating expenses. The corresponding percentage in 1969 was 26.1. The for-hire carriers employed 18,004 persons, up

963 from the 1969 total. Vessel crew members were at 11,800 compared with 11,091 in 1969. The average annual wage per person was at \$6,891 in 1970, compared with \$6,415 the previous year.

More injuries and losses of life were recorded in 1970 compared with 1969. There were 24 fatalities and 1,622 injuries reported, compared with 13 fatalities and 1,502 injuries the previous year. Six vessels, two more than in 1969, were totally written off in accidents. Their value was \$889,632 compared with \$86,889 in 1969. Some 17 fatalities and 1,217 injuries were recorded among vessel crew members. The Inland Division, with the largest labour strength, accounted for a total of 13 fatalities and 1,019 injuries during the year.

Self operated vessels, including those charted from others, were reported at 1,627 for 1970, compared with 1,565 in 1969.

Bareboat Charters

Respondents exclusively chartering their floating equipment bareboat, reported revenues of \$10,452,403, up from the \$8,580,142 in 1969. Net profit before income taxes rose to \$1,865,624 in 1970, compared with the \$1,756,759 in 1969. The number of vessels in this category stood at 203 compared with 182 the previous year.

Private Carriers

This group of 43 carriers operated 203 vessels, entailing total operating expenses of \$129,880,376 in the year. These companies employed 1,601 persons and incurred a payroll of \$14,314,115.
