

PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

OCTOBER, 1951

Oil pipe lines operating in Canada had net receipts of 8,622,717 barrels during October. Gathering systems accounted for 4,186,757 and trunk lines for the remaining 4,435,960 barrels. Over 4,457,500 barrels or 51.7 p.c. of the total originated in the Alberta oil fields while the balance of 4,165,164 barrels entered Canada from United States pipe line connections. October net deliveries were 202,607 barrels from gathering systems and 8,537,820 from trunk lines giving a total of 8,740,427 barrels. Barrels of crude delivered from pipe lines by provinces were: Alberta 1,279,640; Saskatchewan 995,551; Manitoba 2,256,859 (including 1,971,718 barrels for movement to Superior, Wisconsin, through the American section); and Quebec 4.208.377 barrels. Most of the oil transported to Superior ultimately reaches Ontario refineries via oil tankers plying the Great Lakes route. Winter storage facilities are being increased at Superior. South American crudes are generally carried by pipe line from Portland, Maine, to Montreal refineries.

Ten month totals of net deliveries during 1951 reached 73,142,299 barrels including 12.146.500 in transit to Superior via the Lakehead Pipe Line Company. There were 58,932,406 barrels delivered to terminals for refining and storage while the other 2.063,393 barrels were transferred to tank trucks, railway tank cars, etc.

October net deliveries by trunk lines were a record for the year at 8,537,820 barrels, up 453,385 or 5.6 p.c. from the September figure of 8,084,435. On thering systems again declined in net deliveries registering 202,607 barrels against 243,892 barrels in September. Total net deliveries for October of 8,740,427 earrels were the highest recorded to date and stood 412,100 barrels or 4.9 p.c. above the September aggregate of 8,328,327 barrels.

Cumulative net deliveries during the first ten months of 1951 were: trunk lines 70,670,753 barrels and gathering lines 2,471,546 barrels. Gathering systems hendled a daily average of 134,970 barrels during the month under review while trunk lines increased their daily average from 320,063 in September to 324,396 barrels in October. Barrel miles performed by trunk lines advanced from 2,505 million in September to 2,598 million in October. The average miles per barrel carried, however. decreased from 260.9 to 258.4 miles.

Total salaries and wages of the 559 persons employed during October amounted to \$187.301, an increase of \$680 and a decrease of 4 employees from the September totals of \$186,621 and 563 employees.

Montreal Pipe Line carried the greatest volume of cil during October with total deliveries of 4,208,377 barrels or a daily average of 135,754 barrels. Imperial Pipe Line delivered a daily average of 114,376 barrels from its gathering system.

Interprevincial Pipe Line performed a total of 2,232 million barrel miles in trunk lines during the month and transported each barrel of oil an average of 640 miles.

Totals shown in table 6 for receipts and deliveries vary from those given in tables 1 and 2 since table 6 data include all oil received and delivered in intercompany transactions. Reconciliation of these differences follows:

Two trunk lines cross the St. Clair River from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their operations and shortness of the lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics.
