PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

NOVEMBER, 1951

A net total of 7,828,524 barrels of oil were received into Canadian oil pipe lines in November. This represented a seasonal drop of 9.2 p.c. from October when net receipts stood at 8,622,717 barrels. The Alberta oil fields accounted for 4,273,372 barrels or 54.6 p.c. of the November total with the remaining 4,057,309 barrels entering Canada from United States pipe lines. Net deliveries from both gathering and trunk lines were lower in November being 178,031 and 7,870,201 barrels, down 24,576 and 667,619 barrels respectively, from the October deliveries. Oil terminated or delivered by provinces amounted to: 1,245,796 barrels in Alberta; 699,124 in Saskatchewan; 2,007,857 in Manitoba (including 1,511,842 delivered to Lakehead Pipe Line Companythe United States section of the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company system) and 4,095,455 barrels in Quebec out of the Portland connection.

During the first eleven months of 1951, a net total of 81,190,531 barrels were delivered in Canada including 13,658,342 barrels for in transit movement through Superior, Wisconsin, with delivery to Ontario refineries via lake tankers. Refinery and storage terminal deliveries amounted to 65,325,045 barrels while 2,207,144 barrels were transferred for rail and road transport. Gathering systems delivered a net total of 2,649,577 barrels to the end of November while trunk lines delivered 78,540,954 barrels during the eleven months period.

Both gathering and trunk lines showed considerable declines in their daily averages of barrels handled during November. The average for gathering systems fell from 134,970 daily in October to a November movement of 118,925 barrels while the drop for trunk lines was from the October high of 324,396 to November's 315,822 barrels per diem. Total berrel miles reported for oil moved through trunk lines was reduced 332 million miles under the preceding month to a November total of 2,266 million barrel miles. The average length of haul again decreased at 239.1 miles per barrel of oil transported during November. Wages and salaries of employees totalled \$183,941 for the 562 persons employed compared with \$187,301 received in October by 559 workers.

The Montreal Pipe Line transported the largest volume of oil during November with deliveries of 4,095,455 barrels during the 30 days or an average of 136,515 barrels per day, an increase from the daily average of 114,376 barrels delivered in October. The gathering system of Imperial Pipe Line Company delivered a daily average of 99,828 barrels, down 14,548 barrels per day from the October movement but still the largest by far for gathering systems. Winnipeg Pipe Line more than doubled its October oil movement with 449,609 barrels delivered and 33 million barrel miles performed in November. Interprovincial Pipe Line deliveries dropped by some 559,000 barrels and stood at 2,926,180 barrels during November. This resulted in a decrease of 340 million barrel miles to the November crude oil movement of 1,892 million barrel miles performed by Interprovincial. The company moved oil an average of 647 miles, a slight increase over the October mileage of 640.
