## PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS



DECMBER, 1951

During the last month of the year the oil movement through Canadian pipe lines reflected the normal seasonal reduction in demand for 011 products, as well as the closing of navigation on the Great Lakes. The net of $7,322,458$ barrels received was 506,066 barrels or $6.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. under November receipts. A decline of 860,539 barrels or some $11 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. was experienced in net deliveries which amounted to $7,187,693$ barrels during December as compared with $8,048,232$ barrels in the preceding month. By provinces, oil deliveries were as follows during the month under review: Alberta 949,633 berrels, Saskatchewan 820,714, Manitoba 585,377 barrels for provincial consumption and 867,413 routed in transit to Superior. Quebec province reported 3,964,556 barrels.

Gathering systems handled a daily average of 100,894 barrels while 286,264 barrels per day were moved through trunk lines during the month of December. Averages for the year were: gathering systems 112,781 and trunk lines 272,445 barrels per diem. Trunk line carriers performed a total movement of 1,894 million barrel miles to bring the grand total for 1951 to 23,615 million barrel miles. The average distance that oil moved through trunk lines was 212.2 miles per barrel in December and 237.4 miles per barrel over the 12 month period. December amployment figures showed 591 employees earning $\$ 200,936$ while an average of 536 persons employed throughout the year earned a total $\$ 2,063,332$ in straight time and overtime salaries and wages. Total hours worked by eage-earning employees in 1951 amounted to 399,226.

Preliminary tatals show net receipts of $88,641,693$ barrels into Canadian pipe lines for the year 1951. Net deliveries during the year amounted to $88,378,224$ barrels, 85,622,382 from trunk lines and 2,755,842 barrels from gathering systems.

Two new pipe lines came into operation during the month under review. Texaco Exploration Compeny, with a 41 mile trunk line, turned on their valves December 4 th and ofl commenced to flow through the Edmonton Pipe Line Company's 20 mile trunk Iine on December 16th. The December operations of these two Alberta firms have been included in the tables of the current report except where otherwise indicated.

During December, the Montreal pipe Iine delivered an average of 127,889 barrels per day to give a total for the month of $3,964,556$. For the whole year the company delivered $45,645,037$ barrels or 125,055 a day. Imperial pipe line delivered 2,776,038 barrels out of the entire company system with a daily average of 84,742 barrels from the gathering system. Interprovincial pipe line performed 1,527 million barral miles of oil transportation in December and the total of 19,591 million berrel miles for 1951 operations represented almost 83 p.c. of that for all companies. Oil passing through the Interprovincial company line in December travelled an average 601 miles bringing the average for the whole year to 650 miles per berrel transported by Interprovincial.

Table 6 totals are greater than those in tables 1 and 2 by the amount of duplication resulting from inter-company transactions. Keconciliation of differences is given on the following page.

Two trunk lines cross the St. Clair River from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their operations and shortness of the lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as comections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics.
