

OIL PIPE LINE TRANSPORT

JANUARY, 1961

Canadian oil pipe lines received a total of 30,800,000 barrels of crude oil, liquefied petroleum gases and petroleum products during January, 1961. This was a 2.5 per cent decrease from January of last year when 31,600,000 barrels were received but was an increase of 7.3 per cent from the December receipts of 28,700,000 barrels. The receipts were comprised of 17,600,000 barrels of domestic crude oil and L.P.G.'s, 8,100,000 barrels of imported crude oil and 5,100,000 barrels of products.

During the month the oil pipe line industry delivered 31,200,000 barrels of petroleum and its products (1,006,452 barrels per day), a decrease of 0.6 per cent from last year's 31,400,000 barrels but an increase of 12.2 per cent from December. The deliveries included 21,700,000 barrels of crude oil and L.P.G.'s to refineries, 4,300,000 barrels of crude oil and L.P.G.'s for export and 5,200,000 barrels of products.

Trunk line receipts dropped 3.0 per cent from last January. Own gathering systems accounted for 37.9 per cent of the receipts with 15.5 per cent received from other gathering systems. Imports of 8,100,000 barrels were down 4.7 per cent from last January and accounted for 27.2 per cent of the receipts.

Although deliveries to refineries and plants declined from last year, an increase in exports (700,000 barrels) resulted in total deliveries being virtually unchanged. In order to deliver more oil than was received, trunk lines drew down inventories by 450,000 barrels. Total oil held by Canadian pipe line systems amounted to 11,900,000 barrels at the end of the month.

Total traffic of pipe lines amounted to 12,259 million barrel miles, a slight increase from last year; as a result the average haul was 265.8 miles.

Although the total number of employees declined from the same period one year earlier, the total wages paid increased to \$780,145 from \$763,321 and resulted in an increase in total salaries and wages for the Industry.

This is the first Oil Pipe Line Transport report following the use of new reporting forms for the responding companies. The companies were asked to report all receipts and deliveries of oil and to account for all oil handled. This information was tabulated, removing all duplications due to transferring of oil from one pipe line company to another. Totals are therefore total unduplicated receipts or deliveries. Due to variation in company reporting and to give some indication of the volume of intercompany transfers these items are also carried and enter into the gross totals, i.e. totals including duplications. There is some additional oil used as fuel, also oil lost and unaccounted for which have been separated and entered as individual items. Inventory and other changes which include changes in inventory held in bond in the United States are also segregated.

Comparisons between the new series and the old are given. The operations of the pipe lines are divided by product and type of operation.

New categories of receipts and deliveries that are used include the following:

Transfers from L.P.G's to (or from) crude oil stream are to account for liquefied petroleum gases which are mixed into the crude oil and are no longer recorded separately.

Deliveries and receipts from bulk plants and terminals are points of receipt and delivery of refined petroleum products and also include receipts from gas processing plants.
