Average net oil pipeline deliveries soured to a new peak of 348,396 barrels daily in October. This represented a 10.6 p.c. or 33,291 barrel increase over the September figure of 315,105 barrels per day. It was also 23.6 p.c. higher than the 281,949 barrels delivered daily out of Canadian pipelines in October, 1951 and 6.1 p.c. above the previous record of 328,344 barrels a day set in August, 1952.

Total net deliveries for the month at 10,800,280 barrels were 1,347,123 greater than the September movement and 2,059,853 barrels above net deliveries made in October, 1951. Trunk line traffic again was well above the ten million barrel mark with 10,567,070 barrels delivered. This was 1,244,972 higher than September deliveries and 2,029,280 barrels more than the 8,537,820 which trunk lines delivered during October of 1951. Gathering system deliveries rose 102,151 barrels over September and 30,603 above the October, 1951 traffic. Met deliveries in all provinces were greater than those made one year earlier. Comparison of provincial totals in the two periods, 1951 data shown in brackets, is given herewith: Alberta 1,608,084 (1,279,640); Saskatchewan 1,182,367 (995,551); Manitoba 2,965,195 (2,256,859); Ontario 323,829 (Mil\*) and Quebec 4,720,805 (4,208,377) barrels. Manitoba totals include 2,454,982 barrels (1,971,718) transferred to Lakehead Pipe Line Co. and 510,213 barrels (285,141) delivered within the province.

Het receipte of oil for shipment by pipe line in Canada during October included 5,514,761 barrels of Alberta crude, 43,204 of Alberta natural gasoline, 4,760,438 of imported crude and 381,699 barrels of refinery products.

Cumulative net deliveries of 86,724,095 barrels in the ten-month period to October 31 were up 13,581,796 or 18.6 p.c. over the 73,142,299 barrels delivered to the end of October last year. Provincial totals for the tan-month periods follow, with 1951 data in brackets: Alberta 12,912,321 barrels (11,666,334); Saskatchewan 9,053,703 (8,262,860); Manitoba 22,688,125 (15,628,079); Ontario 1,240,650 (Nil\*) and Quebec 40,829,296 barrels (37,585,026). In the ten-month period 17,573,110 barrels (12,146,500) were delivered to the United States sector of the Interprovincial pipe line en route to the lakehead mainly for trans-shipment by lake tanker to Sarnia. These totals were included in Manitoba deliveries as shown above.

A daily average of 151,538 barrels was handled by gathering systems in October, up 16,568 from the October, 1951 average of 134,970. Trunk lines increased deliveries from an average 324,396 barrels per day in October last year to 418,667 daily in the month under review. Traffic on trunk lines represented a total of 3,359 million barrel miles in the current October compared with 2,598 million one year earlier. Totals for the periods January 1 to October 31 showed 19,455 million barrel miles in the ten months of 1951 and a sharp increase to 25,928 million in ten months of 1952. Oil moved virtually the sans distance in October 1952 as in the previous October, the respective lengths of haul being 258,8 miles and 258.4 miles per barrel.

Employment data for the carriers reporting reveal that 703 persons earned \$248,290 in October 1952. These represented 26 p.c. and 33 p.c. increases respectively over the 559 employees and their earnings of \$187,301 recorded in the same month of 1951.

During the ten-month period of 1952 the Montreal pipe line delivered 40,829,296 barrels including 4,720,805 in October. The Imperial pipe line delivered an average 112,796 barrels per day in October to raise its average for the year-to-date to 130,389 barrels daily. An October average of 152,284 barrels per day handled by the Montreal line brought that company's trunk line average for the ten months to 133,867 barrels per diem. The Interprovincial pipe line performed a traffic movement of almost 2.9 billion barrel miles in October raising that firm's total for the period January 1 to October 31 to slightly under 22 billion which was almost 85 p.c. of the total for all companies of 25.9 billion barrel miles.

Operations of the Sarmia Products Fipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of this year. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba and that of the Socony-Vacuum Emploration Co. in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been retained in all other applicable sections of the report.
