PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

NOVEMBER, 1952

A daily net average of 331,309 barrels of oil was delivered out of Canadian pipe lines during November compared with a revised 349,927 barrels in October and an average 268,274 barrels per day in November of 1951. The daily average during the recent November represented a decline of 5.3 p.c. from October but a 23.5 p.c. advance over the average volume moved each day in the previous November. The greatly increased output and delivery of domestic crude has sharply reduced Canada's dependence on foreign oils.

Net deliveries during the month totalled 10,039,263 barrels, down 808,479 from the revised October total of 10,847,742, and 1,991,031 barrels above the November, 1951 movement. Trunk line traffic totalled 9,794,425 barrels, 772,645 less than in October but 1,924,224 above trunk line deliveries in November, 1951. All provinces registered increases over combined trunk and gathering line movement in November, 1951, the comparison between the two periods being as follows (November 1951 data shown in brackets): Alberta 1,344,429 (1,245,796); Saskatchewan 972,746 (699,124); Manitoba 2,837,997 (2,007,857); Ontario 545,473 (Nil*) and Quebec 4,338,618 (4,095,455). Included in Manitoba deliveries is oil passing to the Lakehead Pipe Line Co. destined mainly for Samia and other Ontario ports. These deliveries amounted to 2,413,940 barrels in the current November compared with 1,511,842 during November, 1951.

Net receipts of oil for movement in the Canadian pipe lines during November included 4,998,277 barrels of Alberta crude, 42,635 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 4,228,527 barrels of imported crude and 784,502 barrels of refined oils, gasolines, etc. produced by Ontario and Quebec refineries for distribution through new products pipelines. During the first eleven months of 1952 a net total of 96,946,747 barrels delivered brought a 19.4 p.c. increase over the 81,190,531 barrels delivered in the corresponding period of 1951. Deliveries out of pipelines in the provinces to the end of November were (1951 data in brackets): Alberta 14,440,139 (12,912,130) barrels; Saskatchewan 10,026,449 (8,961,984); Manitoba 25,526,122 (17,635,936); Ontario 1,786,123 (N11*) and Quebec 45,167,914 (41,680,481) barrels. Manitoba totals included 19,987,050 barrels (13,658,342) transferred to the United States sector of the Interprovincial pipe line and scheduled principally for delivery to Ontario points by lake tanker.

Sathering systems handled an average of 145,332 barrels per day during November, down some 7,737 barrels from the intake of 153,069 per day in October but well above the 118,925 received daily in November, 1951. The daily average of 407,991 barrels handled by trunk systems in the month under review showed a gain of 92,109 barrels per day over the 315,882 transported every day during November, 1951. The average length of hau by trunk lines in Movember 1952 was 258,7 miles and the traffic movement totalled 3,166 million barrel miles. Trunk movement in the previous November totalled 2,266 million barrel miles, some 900 M.B.M. lower than in the month under review while average haul or distance moved per barrel at 239.1 miles was almost 20 miles less. Traffic movement in the first eleven months of this year passed the 29 billion barrel miles mark while the movement to November 30th, 1951 was some 21.7 billion. Average haul of oil in the first eleven months of 1952 was 246.8 miles compared with 239.8 miles in the same period of last year.

Persons employed in November numbered 899 and earned \$332,519 while the 562 persons employed in Movember, 1951 had earnings of \$183,941. Wage earners worked 47,487 hours in November versus 32,166 hours one year earlier. Employment and earnings improved sharply due to new companies operating and increased overtime worked.

In the eleven-month period to November 30 the Montreal pipe line delivered 45,167,914 barrels including 4,338,618 during the month under review. Imperial Pipe Line Co. handled a daily average of 125,405 barrels in its gathering system during November raising the daily average for that system to 113,925 barrels per day in the eleven months. Montreal Pipe Line Co. handled 144,621 barrels per day in its trunk lines bringing the average during the January 1 to November 30 period to 134,830 barrels daily. Traffic movement performed by Interprovincial Pipe Line in November totalled over 2.6 billion barrel miles increasing the eleven-month total for the company's transport activities to over 24.6 billion or over 84 p.c. of the total for all companies which was 29.1 billion barrel miles. This report includes initial reports from the following companies: Canadian Gulf Oil Co. and Canadian Gulf Pipe Line Co. operating in Alberta; Saskatoon Pipe Line Co. with operations in Saskatchewan and Trans-Northern Pipe Line Co. which transports products from Montreal refineries to a number of Ontario distributing points.

*Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of 1952. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba and that of the Socony-Vacuum Exploration Co. in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been shown in all other applicable sections of the report.
