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PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

FEBRUARY, 1952

While the total movement of oil through Canadian pipe lines was smaller during the 29 days of February than for January, based on daily averages, net deliveries improved from 227,893 barrels per day in January this year to 228,780 barrels daily in the month under review. An impressive increase of 14.6 p.c. or 29,158 barrels per day was registered over February of 1951 when the average net delivery was 199,622 barrels daily.

In actual figures, net deliveries of oil from trunk lines and gathering systems totalled 6,634,619 harrels in February, down 430,071 from the January aggregate but 1,045,097 barrels or 18.7 p.c. higher than the 5,589,522 barrels delivered in the previous February which was one day shorter. Trunk line net deliveries for the month were 6,483,721 barrels against 6,937,411 in January and 5,333,853 barrels in February, 1951. Deliveries by provinces were (February, 1951 data in brackets): Alberta, 983,031 (1,089,790); Saskatchewan, 757,306 (681,073); Manitoba, 1,327,843 (415,725) and Quebec, 3,566,439 (3,402,934). The Manitoba total included 775,626 barrels turned over to the lines of Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna and 552,217 delivered to refineries within the province. Alberta oil accounted for 45.4 p.c. of the net of 6,470,225 barrels received by Canadian pipe lines during February compared with 41.3 p.c. of the 5,824,050 barrels received a year previously.

Two month totals show a net of 13,699,309 barrels delivered. By provinces the cumulative deliveries were Alberta, 2,273,117; Saskatchewan, 1,569,387; Manitoba, 2,621,387 and Quebec, 7,235,418 barrels. Non-pipe line carriers such as rail, trucks, etc. received 122,718 barrels of oil from Canadian pipe lines in February, down almost 50 p.c. from the 235,577 barrels taken from pipe lines in February, 1951. For the first two months of 1952 these carriers received 220,806 barrels from pipe lines.

Daily averages of oil handled during February were: gathering systems, 98,841 and trunk lines, 280,072 barrels while the February, 1951 movement was a daily 81,715 in gathering systems and 209,234 in trunk lines. Some 1,717 million barrel miles was the total traffic performance of trunk lines during the month under review and gave a two-month total of 3,456 million barrel miles. Length of haul averaged 211.4 miles on trunk lines as compared with 203.2 in January and 158.8 miles in the previous February. Employees numbered 608 and earned \$198,320 against 589 receiving \$194,241 in January and 490 persons paid \$146,323 one year earlier. Montreal Pipe Line Co. continued to be the leader in volume of oil carried and delivered 3,566,439 barrels during February for a two-month total of 7,235,418. Imperial Pipe Line Co., which operates the largest gathering system, delivered an average of 78,911 barrels each day during the month from the gathering system while trunk line deliveries of the Montreal Pipe Line Co. amounted to 122,981 barrels daily. Longer hauls on the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company lines resulted in a 602 mile average trip per barrel carried and brought the two month average to 594 miles per barrel.

Net totals given in table 6 exceed those in tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting
