#### PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

#### MARCH, 1952

Traffic volume as measured by daily averages of net deliveries of oil from Canadian pipe lines, stood at 219,430 barrels for March, a decline of 9,350 barrels per day from the February average of 228,780 but up an impressive 25 p.c. or 43,481 barrels a day over March, 1951 deliveries.

A net total of 6,802,317 barrels of oil was delivered by pipeline during the month of March. This represented an increase of 167,698 barrels over the shorter February period and 1,347,900 above the 5,454,417 barrels pouring from the pipe lines in the previous March. Deliveries from trunk lines were 6,676,710 barrels compared with 6,483,721 in February and 5,239,498 in March of 1951. Provincial totals showed Alberta up 157,656 barrels over the previous March at 946,900; Sagkatchewan 3,465 barrels lower at 747,738 and Quebec up 426,360 to 3,738,291 barrels. Manitoba deliveries more than trebled, being 856,661 barrels heavier for a March, 1952 total of 1,243,781 barrels delivered. This total was composed of 751,803 barrels crossing the United States border into the Lakehead Company's system and 491,978 delivered within the province. These aggregates compare with 228,419 barrels to Lakehead Pipe Line Co. and 158,701 delivered within Manitoba in March, 1951.

The increasing importance of Alberta oil in the national petroleum picture is reflected by the fact that it accounted for 3,116,098 barrels or 45 p.c. of the net of 6,855,479 received by Canadian pipe lines in the current March against 2,077,272 barrels or 38 p.c. of the net 5,400,032 received one year earlier. With the advent of new pipe lines and increases in the capacities of those already operating this percentage should continue to advance.

Net deliveries during the first quarter of 1952 showed a considerable increase of 3,440,193 barrels or 20 p.c. from 17,061,433 in the first three months of 1951 to 20,501,626 in the same period this year. Provincial totals for the first three months were (1951 figures in brackets): Alberta, 3,345,624 (3,128,443); Saskatchewan, 2,317,125 (2,348,539); Manitoba, 3,865,168 (1,383,992) and Quebec, 10,973,709 (10,200,459) barrels. Mon-pipe line carriers received only 317,714 barrels in the three-month period as against 618,105 in the first quarter last year.

Daily averages of oil handled during March were: gathering systems, 99,104 and trunk lines, 267,108 barrels while the March, 1951 movement was a daily 65,783 in gathering systems and 184,665 in trunk lines. Some 1,649 million barrel miles was the total traffic performance of trunk lines during the month under review and gave a three-month total of 5,105 million barrel miles. Length of haul averaged 199,2 miles on trunk lines as compared with 211.4 in February and 158.4 miles in the previous March. Employees numbered 620 and earned \$203,576 against 608 receiving \$198,320 in February and 490 persons paid \$149,406 one year earlier. Montreal Pipe Line Co. continued to be the leader in volume of oil carried and delivered 3,738,291 barrels during March for a three-month total of 10,973,709. Imperial Pipe Line Co., which operates the largest gathering system, delivered an average of 79,173 barrels each day during the month from the gathering system while trunk line deliveries of the Montreal Pipe Line Co. amounted to 120,590 barrels daily. Shorter hauls on the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company lines resulted in a 586 mile average trip per barrel carried and reduced the three-month average to 591 miles per barrel.

Net totals given in table 6 exceed those in tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are reconciled in the following table.
