PIPE LINES (OIL) STATISTICS

A elight decline in net oil deliveries occurred in June when a daily average of 296,882 barrels flowed out of the pipe lines compared with a daily 302,091 in May. June deliveries did, however, register a 12.4 p.c. increase over the 264,240 barrels which left the Canadian pipe lines each day in June, 1951.

Net deliveries in June totalled 8,906,459 barrels, down 458,362 from the May figure of 9,364,821 but up 1,097,565 from the deliveries made in June, 1951. Trunk line deliveries totalled 8,869,155 compared with 9,261,800 in May and 7,538,006 barrels the previous June. Another drop in gathering system net outflow occurred, the June total being 97,304 barrels, down from 103,021 in May and 270,888 during June the previous year. Increases over June, 1951 net deliveries were recorded by Manitoba and Quebec while Alberta and Saskatchewan registered small decreases. Comparative figures by provinces follow, with June, 1951 data in brackets: Alberta 1,156,998 barrels, (1,289,142); Saskatchewan 800,919 (851,850); Manitoba 2,980,676 (2,118,945) and Quebec 3,967,866 (3,548,957). Manitoba totals included transfers to Lakehead Pipe Line Co. 2,392,881 barrels (1,644,411) and delivered within the province 587,795 (474,534).

For the second successive month the Canadian pipe lines carried domestic crude in greater volume than imported oil. June receipts of Alberta oil were a net 4,996,329 barrels while net receipts of foreign crude oil were 4,049,763.

During the first six months of 1952 an increase of 17.5 p.c. or 6,810,811 barrels was registered over half-year totals of net deliveries in 1951. The comparison shows 45,758,937 barrels in the January to June period of 1952 against 38,948,126 in the similar period of 1951. The six-month totals by provinces, with 1951 data in brackets, follow: Alberta 7,136,545 (6,236,717); Saskatchewan 4,635,012 (4,596,984); Manitoba 11,266,115 (6,550,933) and Quebec 22,721,265 barrels (21,563,492). Included in Manitoba totals were 8,274,695 barrels transferred to the United States segment of the Interprovincial pipe line mainly for delivery to Ontario points. This represented a 3,363,592 barrel increase over the 1951 six-month total of 4,911,103.

A daily average of 152,090 barrels handled was the June performance of gathering systems, a considerable gain over the 140,246 per day in the previous June. Trunk line movement was up 81,517 barrels per day from 293,110 in June, 1951 to 374,627 each June day of 1952. Barrel miles performed in June on trunk lines was up considerably from 2,389 million last June to 3,119 million during June this year. Half-year totals of barrel miles amounted to 13,123 million compared with 9,130 million to June 30, 1951. Oil was moved an average 277.5 miles, down slightly from the May average of 282.8 miles per barrel but higher than the 271.7 miles that each barrel moved in June, 1951.

Employees totalled 677 persons and earned \$228,655 in June whereas 531 employees had earned \$170,494 in the previous June.

Both Imperial Pipe Line and the Interprovincial line had greater deliveries than Montreal Pipe Line in June but the latter carried the greatest volume during the first six months of this year. Imperial delivered 4,138,761. Interprovincial 4,040,723 and the Montreal company 3,967,866 barrels during the month of June 1952. Gathering Line activities of Imperial Pipe Line registered a further gain in June with a daily average of 132,082 barrels handled against 128,837 per day during May. Interprovincial handled 134,691 barrels daily in June up from 130,906 in May while Montreal Pipe Line dropped from 135,206 in May to 132,262 barrels each June day. Oil travelled an average 676 miles through the Interprovincial trunk line and a June total of 2,733,000,000 barrel miles was recorded. These items brought a six-month average of 635 miles per barrel in the company's lines and a total of nearly 11 billion barrel miles performed to June 30.

Net totals given in Table 6 exceed those in Tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are accounted for in the table on the next page.
