A net daily average of 328,344 barrels of oil was delivered out of the Canadian pipe lines during August compared with 324,548 daily in July and an average 278,283 barrels per day in August of 1951. The new record movement in August this year represented a 1.2 p.c. increase over July and an 18 p.c. advance over the average volume moved each day in the previous August.

Net deliveries during the month totalled 10,178,679 barrels, 117,706 higher than the July total of 10,060,973 and 1,551,895 barrels above the August, 1951 movement. Trunk line traffic, which reached the ten million barrel mark for the first time, totalled 10,081,605 barrels, 129,462 more than in July and 1,846,445 barrels above trunk deliveries during August, 1951. All provinces except Alberta registered increases over combined trunk and gathering line movement in August 1951, the comparison between the two periods being as follows (August, 1951 data shown in brackets): Alberta 1,316,345 barrels (1,644,253); Saskatchewan 1,096,385 (883,598); Manitoba 3,070,351 barrels (2,266,098); Ontario 132,384 (Nil\*) and Quebec 4,563,214 (3,832,835). Included in Manitoba deliveries is oil passing to the Lakehead Pipe Line Co. largely en route to Sarnia and other Ontario ports. These deliveries amounted to 2,525,599 barrels in the current August compared with 1,665,328 during August, 1951.

Net receipts of oil for movement in the Canadian pips lines during August included 5,430,714 barrels of Alberta crude, 30,238 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline,4,563,041 barrels of imported crude and 133,241 barrels of refinery products.

During the first eight months of 1952 a net total of 66,470,658 barrels delivered brought an 18.5 p.c. increase over the 56,073,545 barrels delivered in the corresponding period of 1951. Deliveries out of pipelines in the provinces to the end of August were (with 1951 data in brackets): Alberta 9,861,382 barrels (9,184,188); Saskatchewan 6,824,729 (6,423,825); Manitoba 17,340,501 (11,170,608); Ontario 741,515 (Nil\*) and Quebec 31,702,531 (29,294,924) barrels. Manitoba totals included 13,348,886 barrels (8,569,188) transferred to the United States sector of the Interprovincial pipe line and destined principally for delivery to Ontario points by lake tanker.

Gathering systems handled an average of 155,229 barrels per day during August thus showing a slight gain over the 151,281 per day in August last year. The daily average of 404,204 barrels handled by trunk systems in the month under review showed a gain of 92,096 barrels per day over the 312,108 transported every day during August, 1951. The average length of haul by trunk lines this August was 269 miles and the traffic movement totalled 3,370 million barrel miles. Trunk movement in the previous August totalled 2,581 million barrel miles, some 789 M.B.M. lower than in the current month but the length of haul at an average 266,8 miles was only slightly lower. Traffic movement in the first eight months of this year approached the 20 billion barrel miles mark while the movement to August 31, 1951 was only some 14.4 billion. Average haul of oil in the first eight months of 1952 was 244,8 miles compared with 233.6 miles in the same period of last year.

Persons employed numbered 696 in August and earned \$242,924 while 558 employees earned \$184,323 in August of 1951. Wage earners worked 42,771 hours in the current August and 39,024 hours a year earlier.

In the eight-month period to August 31 the Montreal pipe line delivered 31,702,531 barrels including 4,563,214 during the month under review. Imperial Pipe Line Co. handled a daily average of 135,032 barrels in its gathering system during August raising the daily average for that system to 107,972 barrels per day in the eight months. Montreal Pipe Line Co. handled 147,200 barrels per day in its trunk lines bringing the average during the January 1 to August 31 period to 129,928 barrels daily. Traffic movement performed by Interprovincial Pipe Line in August totalled over 2.9 billion barrel miles increasing the eight-month total for the company's transport activities to almost 16.8 billion or over 84 p.c. of the total for all companies which was 19.8 billion barrel miles.

Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of this year. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba and that of the Socony-Vacuum Exploration Co. in Alberta have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been retained in all other applicable sections of the report.
