OCTOBER, 1953

The month of October saw the official opening of the Trans Mountain Oil Pipe Line Company's main line between Edmonton, Alta. and Burmaby, adjoining Vancouver, B. C. This line, 718 miles in length, crossing the Canadian Rockies to the Pacific coast, took nineteen months to build and makes available a new source of crude oil to the markets of the Pacific northwest. In Ontario the Sun-Canadian Pipe Line Company, Ltd. opened a line carrying refined products from Sarnia to Toronto.

Total deliveries from oil pipe lines in Canada during October rose to a net average of 416,939 barrels per day, compared with an average of 400,530 barrels in September and 349,927 barrels in October, 1952.

All provinces except Alberta and Quebec showed increased deliveries when compared with October, 1952. The provincial totals were as follows (1952 data in brackets): British Columbia, 267,064 barrels (nil); Alberta, 1,367,199 (1,655,546); Saskatchewan, 1,373,335 (1,182,367); Manitoba 3,669,181 (2,965,195); Ontario, 1,938,187 (323,829), and Quebec, 4,310,143 (4,720,805). Manitoba totals include 3,133,266 barrels (2,454,982) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at Gretna and 535,915 (510,213) delivered within the province.

Included in the net receipts of oil for pipe line shipment during October were 6,493,003 barrels of Alberta crude, 38,085 barrels of Alberta natural gasoline, 77,591 of Manitoba crude, 4,217,934 imported crude and 2,002,806 barrels of refinery products.

Total net receipts of 12,829,419 barrels were 776,819 barrels or 5.7 p.c. below the September receipts of 13,606,238, but 19 p.c. above October last year. Receipts for the ten-month period amounted to 123,589,442 barrels, an increase of 41 p.c. over the same period of 1952.

Deliveries for the ten months, January to October, amounted to 119,985,308 barrels, an increase of 38 p.c. over the 86,907,484 barrels delivered in the corresponding period last year. Provincial totals for the ten months were as follows (1952 data in brackets): British Columbia, 267,064 (nil); Alberta 14,110,827, (13,095,710); Saskatchewan, 11,813,177 (9,053,703); Manitoba, 29,416,491 (22,688,125); Ontario 20,223,614 (1,240,650), and Quebec, 44,154,635 (40,829,296), Manitoba deliveries included 24,328,792 barrels (17,573,110) transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Company at the United States border, destined principally to Ontario refineries via lake tanker.

Gathering systems handled an average of 164,546 barrels per day, down by 18,987 from the September average of 183,533 barrels, but an increase of 11,477 barrels over October, 1952. Trunk line deliveries were up from a daily average of 457,448 barrels in September and 418,667 barrels one year ago to 476,776 barrels in October. This was an increase of 58,109 barrels per day or almost 14 p.c. above October, 1952.

The average length of haul for trunk lines dropped to 238.1 in October from 274.3 in September and 258.8 in October last year. Barrel miles for oil moved through trunk lines also decreased from 3,764 million in September to 3,520 million in October, but were 5 p.c. above the 1952 figure of 3,361 million.

The average number of employees rose to 1,057 compared with 932 in September and 707 in October, 1952. Total salaries and wages amounted to \$385,629, an increase of 14 p.c. over September and 55 p.c. over the October 1952 figure of \$248,712.

Deliveries of the Interprovincial Pipe Line Company increased from 4,199,322 barrels in September to 5,205,896 up by 1,006,574 barrels or 24 p.c. The daily average was raised from 139,977 barrels in September to 167,932 in the month under review and the average for the ten-month period rose to 140,595 compared with 111,275 in the corresponding period of last year. The Montreal Pipe Line Company also showed increased deliveries in October with a total of 4,310,143 barrels compared with 4,194,472 in September. The daily average, however, dropped from 139,816 barrels in September to 139,037. The Imperial Pipe Line Company recorded decreases in both receipts and deliveries, and the daily average for October dropped to 131,600 barrels from an average of 150,526 barrels in the previous month.

Revenue and employee data for the Sarnia Products Line Division of Imperial Cil, Ltd. are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the anglo-Canadian Cils, Linited pipe line in Manitoba have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been shown in all other applicable sections of the report.

* Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of 1952.

The Trans-Northern Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries of refinery products to Ontario terminals in November, 1952. This line runs from Montreal to Hamilton with a spur serving Ottawa.
