A daily net average of 363,273 barrels of oil delivered out of Canadian pipe lines during the 28 days of February established a new record for deliveries, the previous high having been 349,965 barrels daily in December, 1952. The February record compares with deliveries of 345,977 barrels a day in January of this year and 228,780 each day during February, 1952. The two products pipe lines which operate in Ontario and Quebec have contributed heavily to the vastly increased winter movement of petroleum and its products by Canada's pipe line industry. A further factor encouraging the increased movement has been the extra refining capacity installed during 1952 at various points in the Prairie Provinces as well as in Ontario and Quebec.

Net deliveries during the month totalled 10,171,642 barrels, down 553,659 from the January total of 10,725,301 but 3,537,023 barrels above the February, 1952 movement. The Imperial Pipe Line Company commenced in January the reporting of all their operations in Alberta as those of a gathering system. This change in method has resulted in Alberta totals for gathering and trunk deliveries which are not comparable with those reported in 1952. All provinces registered increases over net trunk and gathering line movement in February, 1952, the comparison between the two periods being as follows (February, 1952 data shown in brackets); Alberta 1,328,945 barrels (983,031); Saskatchewan 1,071,621 (757,306); Menitoba 1,732,736 (1,327,843); Ontaric 1,701,198 (nil*) and quebec 4,337,142 barrels (3,566,439). Oil transferred to the Lakehead Pipe Line Co. and destined principally for Ontaric ports, is included in Manitoba deliveries. These deliveries amounted to 1,281,612 barrels in the current February compared with 775,626 during February, 1952.

Net receipts of oil for movement in Canadian pipe lines during February included 4,130,427 barrels of Alberta crude, 40,832 of Alberta natural gasoline, 40,579 of Manitoba crude, 4,347,776 of imported crude and 1,702,207 barrels of refinery products produced in Ontario and Quebec.

In January and February, 1953 a net total of 20,896,943 barrels delivered brought a 52.2 p.c. increase over the 13,699,309 barrels delivered in the corresponding period of 1952. Deliveries out of pipelines in each province to the end of February were (1952 data in brackets): Alberta 2,917,969 barrels (2,273,117); Saskatchewan 2,293,814 (1,569,387); Manitoba 3,414,656 (2,621,387); Ontario 3,216,427 (Ni1*) and quebec 9,054,077 (7,235,418) barrels. Manitoba totals included 2,473,080 barrels (1,551,733) transferred to the United States sector of the Interprovincial Pipe Line and scheduled principally for delivery to Ontario points by lake tanker after the opening of navigation on the Great Lakes.

Gathering systems handled an average of 124,645 barrels per day during February, up some 25,804 barrels over the 38,841 per day in February, 1952. The change in reporting by the Imperial Pipe Line Co. resulted in somewhat lower trunk line data for February than would have occurred had the method of reporting remained the same. Trunk deliveries, however, stood at the high level of 384,478 barrels handled daily. This was 104,406 barrels per day above the February, 1952 figure of 280,072 barrels.

The average length of haul by trunk lines in February, 1953 was 238.2 miles and the traffic movement totalled 2,565 million barrel miles. Trunk movement in the previous Foorwary totalled 1,717 million barrel miles and the average haul or distance per barrel was 211.4 miles. Total traffic of nearly 5.2 billion barrel miles was achieved in the first two months of this year compared with less than 3.5 billion in January and February of 1952.

Persons employed in February numbered 869 and they earned \$300,953, while the 607 persons employed in February of 1952 had earnings of \$197,998. Wage earners worked 44,327 hours in February versus 35,001 one year earlier.

In the two months ended February 28, 1953 the Montreal Pipe Line delivered 9,054,077 barrels including 4,337,142 during the month under review. The Imperial Pipe Line in Alberta, which now shows all deliveries as gathering system deliveries reported a daily average of 102,656 barrels handled in February and a daily 103,794 for the first two months. Montreal Pipe Line Co. handled a record 154,898 barrels per day in its trunk lines during February bringing the average for that company in the first 59 days of 1953 to 153,459 barrels daily.

Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of 1952. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been shown in all other applicable sections of the report. Trans-Northern Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries of refinery products to Onterio terminals in November, 1952. This line runs from Montreal to Hamilton with a spur serving Ottawa.

Net totals given in Table 6 exceed those in Tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are accounted for in the following table.

Two trunk lines crose the St. Clair River from the United States at Sarnia. The limited nature of their operations and shortness of the lines are such that they have been considered for purposes of this report merely as connections to refinery facilities in Canada and are not included in Canadian oil pipe line statistics.
