MARCH, 1953

The March movement of oil through Canadian pipe lines stood at 351,784 barrels delivered daily. This represented a minor decline of 3.2 p.c. from the record 363,273 daily in February this year but was an impressive 60.3 p.c. above the 219,430 barrels delivered each day in March, 1952 and was almost double the 175,949 barrels a day reported for the same month of 1951.

A net 10,905,306 barrels flowed out of the Canadian pipe lines during March thus setting a new record for total deliveries in one month. This was 733,664 barrels higher than the February total of 10,171,642 and 4,102,989 barrels or over 60 p.c. above the 6,802,317 moved in March, 1952. Due to a change in reporting by the Imperial Pipe Line Company, Alberta totals for trunk line and gathering system deliveries are not comparable with those reported in 1952; however, combined totals for all lines are comparable. All provinces had increases over the net oil movement in March, 1952. Deliveries in the several provinces were (March, 1952 in brackets): Alberta 1,315,496 barrels (1,072,507); Saskatchewan 938,854 (747,738); Manitoba 2,113,005 (1,243,781); Ontario 2,187,284 (Nil ) and Quebec 4,350,667 barrels (3,738,291). Included in the Manitoba totals were: via Lakehead Pipe Line Co. to Superior, Wisconsin and thence mainly for shipment to Ontario refineries by lake tanker 1,626,429 (751,803) and delivered within the province 486,576 barrels (491,978).

March net receipts of oil for shipment by pipe line in Canada included 4,339,493 barrels of Alberta crude, 43,483 of Alberta natural gasoline, 37,798 barrels of Manitoba crude, 4,400,717 of imported crude and 2,180,246 barrels of refinery products. The petroleum products transported were produced by Ontario and Quebec refineries from both domestic and foreign crudes, and were consumed almost completely in Ontario.

Net deliveries of 31,802,249 barrels during the first three months of 1953 were 11,300,623 barrels or 55 p.c. above the 20,501,626 delivered in the like period of 1952. Deliveries in each province during the three months were (1952 data in brackets): Alberta 4,233,465 barrels (3,345,624); Saskatchewan 3,232,668 (2,317,125); Manitoba 5,527,661 (3,865,168); Ontario 5,403,711 (Nil\*) and Quebec 13,404,744 barrels (17,703,00). The total for Manitoba included eil en route to Superior. This movement of 4,099,509 barrels was up 1,795,973 or 78 p.c. from the first quarter of 1952 when 2,303,536 barrels were transferred. Oil delivered to points within the province declined 8 p.c. from 1,561,632 barrels to 1,428,152 barrels in a like comparison.

Gathering systems handled a daily average of 117,722 barrels in March, well ahead of the 99,104 moved each day in March, 1952. An average 376,518 barrels were handled per diem by trunk lines compared with 267,108 per day the previous March. The change in reporting by Imperial Pipe Line Co. resulted in a smaller trunk line total for the current March than would otherwise have been compiled. Oil transport accomplished by trunk lines in March, 1953 totalled 2,917 million barrel miles against 1,650 million one year earlier. Three month totals to March 31st were: for 1953, 8,112 million barrel miles and for 1952, 5,105 million. The average length of haul in March, 1953 was 250 miles as against 199 miles in the corresponding period a year earlier.

Earnings of 875 employees reported for March were \$341,447 while the 869 employed in February received \$300,953. Some 619 persons had earnings of \$203,182 in March of 1952. Employment thus increased 41.4 p.c., and earnings 68.0 p.c. as compared with the same month of 1952.

The Montreal Pipe Line delivered 4,350,667 barrels during March to bring its first quarter total to 13,404,744. Imperial Pipe Line reported a daily movement of 96,558 barrels in its gathering system in March and 101,302 barrels per day in the first three months of the year. A daily 140,344 barrels was handled by the Montreal line. Opera ting revenues of Interprovincial Pipe Line Company to March 31st, 1953 were \$2,682,266 or 52.2 p.c. of the total \$5,-143,278 for all companies. Comparison with earnings during the first quarter of 1952 shows Interprovincial up \$373,284 or 16.2 p.c.; Imperial Pipe Line Co. up 11.0 p.c. from \$651,976 to \$723,488, Montreal Pipe Line Co. improved 16.6 p.c. from \$381,109 to \$444,475 and all companies up \$1,407,451 or 37.7 p.c.

\* Operations of the Sarnia Products Pipe Line Division of Imperial Oil Ltd. commenced in March of 1952. Revenue and employee data for the pipe line are not available for this report as the pipe line operation forms only a part of the Company's activities and is not separable. For the same reason revenue and employee data of the Anglo-Canadian Oils Limited pipe line in Manitoba have been omitted. Data on the activities of these companies have been shown in all other applicable sections of the report. Trans-Northern Pipe Line Company made its first deliveries of refinery products to Ontario terminals in November, 1952. This line runs from Montreal to Hamilton with a spur serving Ottawa.

# D.B.S. MEMORANDUM

Het totals given in Table 6 exceed those in Tables 1 and 2 because of duplications resulting from intercompany transfers of oil. These differences are accounted for in the following table.
